Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Next Sunday is our June Fundraiser which consists of a meal and dance. Invite your family and friends to come out for a day of good food and fellowship and to an afternoon of dancing to the Jodie Mikula Orchestra.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord into Heaven. Only Jesus has the ability to raise Himself into the skies, into the heavens, and touch the Face of God. However, this is something we look forward to doing after our own resurrection after the Second Coming of Jesus. Every Sunday and Holy Day we recite the Nicene Creed in which we profess our belief in today's celebration. We say, “*He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.*” The Apostles and disciples of Jesus watched as Jesus went up to join His Father in Heaven. I am sure that they were sad to see Jesus leave them, but they probably remembered Jesus's words as He told them that He would send them the Paraclete, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with them, to guide and protect them from the devil. But yet as we hear in the Acts of the Apostles they asked Jesus, “*Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?*” The Apostles were still thinking in earthly terms and not spiritually. However, as we read on, the Apostles and other disciples come to realize the fullness of the truth which Jesus spoke after they received the gift of the Holy Spirit on the feast of Pentecost, which we will celebrate next weekend. So the Solemnity of the Ascension not only expresses the divinity of Jesus, but the Ascension also fills us with hope of what is to come, the coming of the Holy Spirit and our eternal life with our Lord. On this Ascension weekend, let us open our hearts to receive the Spirit as we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus at this Mass and then we will truly be a superhuman being, one filled with the grace and power of God.

As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost next Sunday, I would encourage you to say the Prayer to the Holy Spirit each day this week.

**Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful
and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love.
Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created.
And Thou shalt renew the face of the earth.
O God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit,
didst instruct the hearts of the faithful,
grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise
and ever to rejoice in His consolation.
Through Christ our Lord. Amen**

Also, in the spirit of Pentecost I would recommend that you wear something of the color red to Mass next weekend. Red is the liturgical color that we wear during Mass on the feast of Pentecost. May it be a sign of our unity and of our seeking the Spirit to come upon us so that we can proclaim Jesus and be Jesus to everyone we meet.

This week all the priests of the Diocese of Austin will be meeting with our bishop, Joe Vásquez, at Horseshoe Bay. Please pray for us all as we discuss various topics and as we also enjoy some time together.

May all of you have a most blessed week.
