Dear friends in Christ.

Today is Father's Day. We honor all fathers, especially those who live their lives in faithfulness to Jesus Christ and to His Church. After all, all fathers are called to be living examples of Jesus to their children. All fathers are called to assist their children in attaining eternal life, which means helping them to live a life of faithfulness to Jesus, correcting and encouraging as needed. May God bless all fathers in their awesome responsibility. Happy Father's Day!

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. Since the time of the Apostles the Church has believed and taught that Jesus is present, body and blood, soul and divinity, in the Holy Communion that we receive at Mass. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus during the consecration in the Eucharistic Prayer. The appearance remains the same, but the substance changes. This is not a symbolic presence, but, it is the REAL PRESENCE of Jesus. That is why we take such care of the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist, and offer to the Real Presence of Jesus our Adoration and Praise. That is why we have our annual Corpus Christi Procession to give a more public witness of our belief in this Real Presence. The early Church Fathers wrote about this presence, as did St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 10:16–17, 11:23–29). May we all be careful of how we speak about the Holy Communion that we receive at Mass. We should speak of it as the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ, not just bread and wine. And, just as Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes in today's Gospel, Jesus continues to multiply His presence around the world as Mass is celebrated. He continues to feed and nourish us so that we may have the strength we need to live the life He has given us to live. We pray that one day all Christians will once again believe what the Apostles and the early Church believed about Jesus' Real Presence in Holy Communion.

Because of our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and His being present in the Tabernacle in church, we ask that everyone always take special care of how you dress when you come to Mass. Do you dress in a way that shows you truly understand that you are entering into the church to visit the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords, the True and Only God? This is why we ask that you do not wear shorts to Mass and why you should always practice a spirit of silence when you are in the church. My prayer is that one day everyone will understand this and observe it, not for me, but for our God.

Next weekend Fr. Don Lofton will be here to celebrate Mass with you. He is a retired priest and lives at the John Paul II Residents for Priests in Georgetown. The first weekend of July Fr. Jim Olnhausen will be here. Most of you know him as he has been here several times before. Please give them a good Corn Hill welcome.

Eucharistická oběť je "zdrojem a vrcholem celého křesťanského života. "Vždyť nejsvětější eucharistie obsahuje celé duchovní dobro církve, Krista samého, našeho velikonočního Beránka a živý chléb. Skrze své tělo, Duchem Svatým oživované a oživující, dává lidem život". Proto církev stále upírá svůj pohled na Pána ve Svátosti oltářní, v níž odhaluje plné vyjádření jeho nesmírné lásky.

Nemusíme čekat až po smrti

Ten, kdo se živí Kristem v eucharistii, nemusí čekat na věčný život až po smrti: má jej už na zemi jako prvotinu budoucí plnosti, která pojme člověka v jeho úplnosti.
