#### Dear friends in Christ,

This week we celebrate the **Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary** on Thursday, September 8. You may want to bake a birthday cake at home and celebrate with your family. This would be a good day to pray the rosary together as a family also. Happy Birthday Mary! Our **Parish Bazaar** is two weeks away. If you have not signed up to work please do so by signing up on the list at the entrance of the church for the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

In today's Gospel taken from Luke 14:25-33 Jesus says, "...anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Jesus also says, "If anyone of you comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." What on earth is Jesus talking about? He is simply saying that He cannot be second place in your life. You must put Him and living your faith in first place. Jesus and you being His disciple, must take priority over everything else. Can you say this about your life? Does coming to Mass every weekend come first in your weekly schedule? Or, do you sometime miss Mass because of sports, outings or other things? If we say that Jesus is in first place in our life, then we will try to be at Mass every weekend. We will arrange our schedule around our time for Mass. It also means that we will speak to our Lord everyday in prayer and that we will read His Word in the Bible. It also means that we will do all we can to stay in good standing with the Church so that we are able to receive our Lord in Holy Communion. All of the decisions we make in life need to be made according to what Jesus has taught us. Do we think about our faith before we make decisions? We must be willing to endure persecution, hardships, abandonment, insults, and many other things for the sake of Christ. This is what it means to carry your cross. When someone treats you badly because of your faith in Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church, then you are truly carrying the cross as you should carry it. So many people give up their cross just so other people will like them or be nice to them. When we do this it is like spitting in Jesus' face as the Roman soldiers did when they persecuted Him. How well do you carry your cross for Jesus? The temptation to drop it and run is always before us. Let us cling to Jesus and to His cross and truly live our life in Him.

Monday, September 4, is Labor Day. Many of you will have the day off from work while many others of you will be working. Give thanks to God for the work that you do and do all of your work for the greater honor and glory of God. May all of you have a blessed Labor Day.

**K úvaze**: Divný to Ježíšův přístup: místo aby pochválil davy, že ho následují, místo aby jim přislíbil hojnou odměnu, vyjadřuje nespokojenost: nestačí ho následovat, je třeba udělat víc. Ježíš tak nakládá další břemeno na tyto "snaživce". Nedopustil se v tomto případě "pastorační chyby" či přehmatu? Neměl se raději spokojit s jejich dobrou vůlí? Kristus, navzdory povrchnímu zdání, nepřidal další břemeno, ale spíš od všech možných (i nemožných) břemen vysvobodil. Vysvobodil a uschopnil ke hbitému a plnému následování. Vždyť ti lidé chtěli následovat Krista (a skutečně ho následovali), ale byli jen… na poloviční cestě. Udělali jen první počáteční krok: nechali se přitáhnout Ježíšovou osobou. Ale to bylo málo. Bylo třeba se rozhodnout zcela, aby toto následování neskončilo fiaskem a výsměchem. Proto ta dvě podobenství o králi a staviteli věže: tak jako tito dva se museli připravit a "uschopnit" k dokončení díla, i Kristovi následovníci se musí "uschopnit". A tímto uschopněním je "osvobození" ode všech pout (rodinných, majetkových a egocentrických), které brání člověku při chůzi: jsou mu spíš břemenem, kamínkem v botě, který tlačí a znemožňuje pohodlně kráčet.

Takže Kristova výzva není dalším břemenem, ale oproštěním od břemen. Ježíš volá ke svobodě. Zároveň jeho výzva je i praktickou radou: bez takového plného rozhodnutí, zahrnujícího všechny lidské vztahy a rozměry života, skončí prvopočáteční "dobrá vůle" neúspěchem, nezdarem. Ona dobrá vůle je jen začátkem, polovinou následování Krista. A dělat věci jen polovičatě nevede k cíli. Tak jako je nesmyslné začít školu a nedokončit ji, jako je nesmyslné začít stavět dům a nedokončit ho, podobně je nerozumné a pošetilé následovat Krista … a nedotáhnout to do konce, do všech důsledků. Takové následování nestačí. Je třeba následovat Krista ve všech oblastech svého života, dávat mu přednost před hmotnými věcmi, před rodinou, před sebou samotným. Protože pokud jsme objevili Krista jako drahocennou perlu, bylo by takřka nemožné nedat za něj všechno.
