Holy Trinity Catholic Church hosts in Partnership with Elite Medical Imaging, their annual Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening on **Saturday, October 1, 2022**. Screenings will be done in the CCE Room by appointment only. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: carotid artery, abdominal aorta, thyroid, liver, spleen, gallbladder and both kidneys. These screenings are not typically done at physician's visits or at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered to you for \$60 each or the full preventive package, (all 8 areas) for just \$170.00! Flex spending and Health Savings accounts may be used to pay for these screenings the day of service, as well as cash and all major credit/debit cards. Our radiologist team recommends these screenings be considered on

an annual basis as a preventive measure. Oftentimes results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors, family history and lifestyle. A representative from EMI will be at Holy Trinity **September 24th and 25th** to offer pre-registration and answer any questions you may have. Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you! Our Parish Bazaar is next Sunday. If you have not signed up to work please stop by the table in the foyer of the church after Mass to sign up to work in the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

This week we celebrate many feast days. Two of these are The Exaltation of the Holy Cross on Wednesday, September 14, and Our Lady of Sorrows on Thursday, September 15. It is through Jesus' death on the cross that salvation comes to us all. This feast day celebrates the finding of the true cross by St. Helena in the year 320 who was the empress of the time. This feast also celebrates the first church built over the empty grave of Jesus in the year 335. On the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows we remember the suffering Mary endured because of the cross of Jesus. Just as the prophet Simeon had foretold, a sword of sorrow would pierce the heart of Mary as she saw her Son, Jesus, die on the cross. Traditionally the "sorrows" of Mary number seven: 1) the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, 2) the flight into Egypt, 3) Jesus being lost in Jerusalem, 4) the meeting of Mary and Jesus on the way to Calvary, 5) the crucifixion, 6) the taking down of Jesus' body from the cross, 7) Jesus' burial. Mary can be of assistance to us in our times of sorrow. Ask Mary for her intercession to our Lord to assist you to overcome your times of sorrow and sadness so that you can rejoice with her in the new life Jesus promises to those who love Him.

Today's Gospel contains several parables. The main message is that heaven rejoices in those who turn away from their sin and seek God's mercy and forgiveness. God always welcomes the sinner who repents, who is truly sorry for their sins and wants union with Him. This is one of the main themes during this Jubilee Year of Mercy. God's mercy is available to all who come to Him with a sincere and contrite heart, a heart that is sorrowful, a heart that is open to change and conversion. Let us pray that we always have the courage to admit to our own sins and then go to Confession seeking God's forgiveness. God is there waiting for us and He comes to us and meets us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. May we always run to His open arms.
