Holy Trinity Catholic Church hosts in Partnership with Elite Medical Imaging, their annual Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 1, 2022</u>. Screenings will be done in the CCE Room by appointment only. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: carotid artery, abdominal aorta, thyroid, liver, spleen, gallbladder and both kidneys. These screenings are not typically done at physician's visits or at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered to you for \$60 each or the full preventive package, (all 8 areas) for just \$170.00! Flex spending and Health Savings accounts may be used to pay for these screenings the day of service, as well as cash and all major credit/debit cards. Our radiologist team recommends these screenings be considered on

an annual basis as a preventive measure. Oftentimes results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors, family history and lifestyle. A representative from EMI will be at Holy Trinity at all weekend Masses of <u>September 24 /25</u> to offer pre-registration and answer any questions you may have. Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

All Soul's Memorial Envelopes are available by the bulletins and <u>must be turned in by Wednesday, October 26</u>. The names offered will be prayed for throughout the month of November.

Dear friends in Christ.

May the love and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. A big "THANK YOU" to everyone who help out with the Bazaar last Sunday. Thank you especially to those who spent weeks making all the preparations, to those who set up and took down for the Bazaar, the cooks and everyone else. I know that some of you took off from work to be here to make the necessary preparations, for this I give you thanks for your sacrifices. Thank you everyone who bid at the silent and live auctions. We appreciate your generosity. May the Lord bless all of you in return.

Autumn has arrived and soon we will begin the festivities of this season. Next Sunday is Respect Life Sunday and October is Respect Life month so in a special way we celebrate the gift of life and we try to protect the sacredness of life through our prayers and our actions. We really need to pray for the conversion of hearts and minds so that all people will realize that all life, from the first moment of conception to natural death, is sacred and that we are all made in the image and likeness of God. Pray especially for those individuals who are standing in front of abortion clinics in other states praying for those who are going to have their babies killed in their womb. Just their presence there in prayer oftentimes changes the minds of those who are going to these clinics. Many times those who work in these clinics undergo a change of heart and quit their jobs as they come realize the horror they are committing. Even though the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, now the battle for life has gone to each individual state. Also, Congress is still trying to pass legislation to make abortion legal in all the USA. So, much work is still to be done. May abortion come to an end one day in this country and throughout the world and may the evils of contraception also come to an end so that the life that God intends will be born into the world.

I remember that a year or so after my ordination the Church predicted that there would be a labor shortage by the year 2025 due to the death of the Baby Boom generation. With the pandemic the past two years this labor shortage has come a little early. Some people say it is because no one wants to work. Yes, that is part of it, but this has always been so. The Church said that abortion and contraception would be the main reason for this labor shortage throughout the world. Just think how many lives have been killed or prevented from entering into this world because of abortion and contraception. It is in the hundreds of millions of people! No wonder we have this labor shortage at this time. May the heart of all people be changed to reject these ungodly practices.

This week we celebrate the feast of St. Wenceslaus. St. Wenceslaus (903-29), also known in Czech as Vaclav, was born near Prague, and was the son of Duke Wratislaw. He was taught Christianity by his grandmother, St. Ludmila. The Magyars, along with Drahomira, an anti-Christian faction murdered the Duke and St. Ludmila, and took over the government. Wenceslaus was declared the new ruler after a coup in 922. He encouraged Christianity. Boleslav, his brother, no longer successor to the throne, after Wenceslaus' son was born, joined a group of noble Czech dissenters. In September of 935 a group of nobles allied with Wenceslaus's younger brother, Boleslav, in a plot to kill the prince. After Boleslav invited Wenceslaus to the feast of Saints Cosmas and Damian in Stará Boleslav, Boleslav and three of his companions – Tira, Čsta and Hněvsa – murdered Wenceslaus on his way to morning Mass. Boleslav thus succeeded him as the Duke (kníže) of Bohemia. St. Wenceslaus is the patron saint of the Czech Republic and Slovakia and his feast day is Sept. 28.

In today's Gospel reading we see what happens to a person who is not allowing the Holy Spirit to be their coach in life. Instead of following the "game plan" of the Spirit of God, the rich man followed his own "game plan", a plan in which he was only focused on himself and his needs. Because he only thought of himself the rich man never saw the beggar, Lazarus, at his gate. Therefore, he never did anything to help Lazarus. Lazarus, having suffered much, died and went to heaven. The rich man went to hell. When we live only for ourselves, being selfish and self-centered, we are not following the Holy Spirit's "game plan". We begin to die spiritually. But if we follow the "game plan" of the Holy Spirit, which is revealed to us through Scripture and the Church, we grow to become like Jesus and are invited to share in His eternal kingdom, His eternal "game plan". Which "game plan" are you following in your life? Let us pray that we are following God's "game plan" and that our ears and our heart will be open to listen to our coach, the Holy Spirit.

Dnešní evangelium mluví jako "pravověrný evangelík". Zdůrazňuje totiž Boží slovo jako hlavní a dostatečný pramen informací, které jsou potřebné k tomu, aby člověk došel k obrácení, k pokání (pokání je tím, co by chtěl bohatý muž pro své bratry, v něm vidí správně řešení). Pro nás je ovšem "výběr" ještě bohatší, než pro Ježíšovy posluchače, kromě Mojžíše a proroků máme celý Nový zákon. Celé Písmo tedy obsahuje dostatečné množství informací, potřebných k obrácení a tedy ke spáse. Je třeba se znovu a znovu ptát, jestli tyto texty Písma posloucháme jako slova, která nás mohou a mají ke spáse dovést a jestli jsme o jejich "plné moci" skutečně přesvědčení.
