Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

#### Dear friends in Christ.

Inserted in this bulletin you will find our Holy Day/Holiday schedule. Please put it in a visible place in your home to help you prepare to come to Mass for the upcoming Holy Days and Holidays.

**During this month of October we celebrate the month of the Rosary.** The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is this Friday, October 7. Mass will be at 6:00 pm. We will also pray the Rosary at 11:00 am and we will also have the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick immediately after the Rosary. You may ask, "Why should we pray the Rosary?" Because it is a meditation on the life of Jesus and Mary. And, the prayers of the Rosary come from the Bible as well and are an expression of our life of faith. Just by reflecting on the mysteries of the Rosary you will cover the entire life of Jesus, from the moment of conception to His ascension into Heaven. So, pray the Rosary daily and enter into the fullness of the life of Jesus Christ. Mary wants all of us to have a closer relationship with her Son, that's why she gave us the Rosary to meditate upon.

October is also Respect Life Month. Let us all learn what the Church teaches about life issues, whether they are about domestic violence, abortion, birth control, embryonic stem cell research, the death penalty, the elderly, the dying, the poor, immigration, and many other issues. All of these are important, but abortion is the most serious because it is the killing of a baby in the womb of its mother. It is the killing of the most innocent of life. Let us pray that the eyes of all may be opened to this horrible tragedy that takes place every day.

This month is also **Czech Heritage Month**. Let us pray for a renewal of faith in the Czech Republic. Many in our parish are of Czech ancestry. May we appreciate those who have gone before us and have given us our Czech heritage.

In today's Gospel it says: "The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith." Do you ever tell this to Jesus? Faith is something we often take for granted. We really do not appreciate the gift of faith that we have been given as we should. If we ignore our faith then it is very likely that we will lose it. Once we lose our faith, it is difficult to get it back. That is why we need to reflect our faith every day. We need to ask for an increase of faith and ask the Lord to help us have a strong faith so that we can endure the challenges that our daily lives presents to us. For a good reflection on faith please read chapter 11 in the Letter to the Hebrews in the New Testament. Think about the faith of the ancients, such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, Elijah, Jeremiah, and many others. They had great faith, trusting in the Lord even though they did not know where God was leading them or how things would work out for them. At the end of today's Second Reading it says: "...the just one, because of his faith, shall live." Pray for an increase in faith and live the fullness of life God has for you.

May all of you have a most blessed week.



**K úvaze**: Jsme jen služebníci: tato věta by mohla vyvolat smutek a depresivní myšlenky, že koneckonců naše služba Bohu je ceněna velmi málo, vždyť je přirovnána službě otroků. A tyto úvahy by mohly dovést k otázkám: Jakou cenu má vlastně náš život? Nesloužíme jen "nenasytnému tyranu", který chce jen naši službu a oddanost? Tyto myšlenky by nebyly zas tak nové, vyslovil je už Nietsche před 100 letv.

Především je nutné říct, že evangelium o "služebnících" nás osvobozuje od velikášství, od namyšlenosti, že jsme kdovíjaké hvězdy v Božích očích, protože mu bezvýhradně sloužíme. Evangelium nás staví do "správné role": naše služba není darem Bohu, ale spíš povinností. Řečeno jinak: není to "laskavost" projevená Bohu, ale nutnost. Tak jako je zcela přirozené a normální dýchat, jíst, spát, mělo by být zcela normální sloužit Kristu. Není to "nadstandardním příslušenstvím našeho života", ale základním vybavením, přirozenou a neodmyslitelnou součástí.

Potíž je v tom, že hřích převrátil náš vztah k Bohu: sloužit mu není pro nás něčím "přirozeným", ale "trochu výjimečným". A pokud mu přece jen projevujeme tu velkou laskavost, že mu sloužíme, tak si často o sobě myslíme, kdovíjak nejsme skvělí: vždyť ostatní lidé přece tak nežijí nebo nekonají toho tolik pro Boha. Někdy si v duchu myslíme (třeba podvědomě), že tato naše služba nám dává zvláštní statut před Bohem, nárok na zvláštní milosti a privilegia. A tu Ježíš přichází a boří tyto naše falešné představy, zámky postavené na písku: sloužit Bohu není "milostí", ale povinností. A Bůh nám není ničím povinen ani zavázán: že však "odměňuje" a bohatě dává, není z povinnosti, ale z milosti. Nemusel by odměňovat naši službu, ale on ji chce odměnit. Protože je tak dobrý. #### Dear Brothers and Sisters:

October is Respect Life and World Missions Month. During these next several weeks, we have an opportunity to engage in acts of generosity, which are a tremendous blessing to the Body of Christ. This is a distinctive time of the year when the Church promotes the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death and cultivates awareness and support for the 1,150 mission territories of the Catholic Church.

The Respect Life Program begins the weekend of October 1-2. This year's theme is, "Serving Moms in Need: Living the Gospel of Life." This theme calls us to offer Christ's presence and love to mothers in their time of need through our faithful service and support.

On World Mission Sunday, October 23, Catholics are invited to pray and sacrifice for the entire world, not just one particular mission. Pope Francis' message for this year reflects the theme, "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8), and he reminds us that "every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ." The annual Propagation of the Faith collection will be taken on World Mission Sunday. The missionary work of the Catholic Church relies on this annual collection to support mission dioceses and to continue evangelizing and serving the poorest and most disadvantaged in remote areas throughout the world.

I invite you to be generous in supporting this annual collection. As we approach our work of evangelization, we are reminded that the Church of God is universal, not alien to any people. Evangelization is the Church's deepest identity, a particular grace and vocation proper to the whole People of God, as the Church exists to evangelize. It is our love for Jesus and humanity authenticated through our prayers and actions that we can continue to build heaven on earth.
