We will have our monthly **Building Fund Collection** next weekend (October 15/16). Thank you in advance for your generosity.

Hurricane Ian Second Collection - As we continue to see the destruction caused by Hurricane Ian, Bishop Vásquez asks that parishes take up a second collection on the weekend of October 15/16. In a letter the US Bishops, Archbishop Gomez explains, "As a result of Hurricane Ian's havoc – first across Cuba and the Dominican Republic and then the southeast US starting in Florida – lives have been lost and many Church properties, along with homes and businesses, have been severely damaged or destroyed. This followed the impact of Hurricane Fiona, which caused devastation across Puerto Rico and other parts of the Caribbean." The funds collected in this special appeal will become part of the Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund and will be used to support the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church as well as the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and Catholic Relief Services. This collection will be taken up along with the Building Fund, so please indicate on the donation that it is for the Hurricane Ian Second Collection.

Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

EIM COMPLIANCE NEWS AND IMPORTANT DATES: The EIM Office is converting the EIM database and training programs to VIRTUS products over the next few months. To make the data conversion process as smooth and accurate as possible:

<u>NEW APPLICANTS</u>: If you are new to ministry in the Diocese of Austin and wish to serve between now and early January, 2023, you must <u>submit an EIM Application for Ministry (austindiocese.org/application) BY OCTOBER 31, and attend an in-person EIM Workshop (austindiocese.org/initial-eim-training) BY NOVEMBER 15.</u>

o No new EIM applications will be accepted from November 1-January 2, 2023.

o Beginning January 3rd, new applicants will register through VIRTUS Online.

o There will be no EIM Workshops held between November 16 and early January 2023.

CURRENT/EXISTING APPLICANTS: If you will serve in ministry between now and the end of the calendar year, you must be compliant through the end of the year by NOVEMBER 15.

o There will be no online EIM training available between November 16 and January 2, 2023.

o If you need to update/renew your compliance, online EIM training is available at (austindiocese.org/onlineeimtraining) until end

of day November 15 (you do not need to login to your EIM account to complete the online EIM training).

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. We have had some beautiful weather recently. Hope you have been able to enjoy it. The beauty of God's creation is amazing!

Our **Bazaar Report** is inserted into today's bulletin. We received a couple of more bills this week so I think all of it is up-to-date now. The income from the Bazaar was slightly less than last year, but, it is still excellent and truly amazing. Thank you to everyone who made the Bazaar to be successful again this year. I appreciate your hard work.

This week we will celebrate the feast of St. Pope John XXIII on Tuesday. Many of you will remember him as he was Pope from 1958 to 1963. Saturday is the feast day of St. Teresa of Jesus, also known as St. Teresa of Avila. She was truly a remarkable woman of the 16th century.

Don't forget that this is Respect Life month. Continue to pray for those who are praying in front of abortion clinics, those who are going there for abortions, and those who are working for Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities killing babies in the wombs of their mothers. May they have a conversion of heart and mind and may God's mercy be with them. May they see the evil that they are doing.

October is also the month of the rosary. **Be sure to pray the rosary daily with your family**. May the love and protection of our Blessed Mother Mary be with you all. Also, please join us today, Sunday, October 9, at 3:00 pm to participate in the Coast to Coast Rosary as we pray for our nation.

Our first reading from the Second Book of Kings tells a story of the healing of the leprosy of Naaman, a general in the king's army. In his day the leper was an outcast. The thought of living with leprosy terrorized people. Elisha, a man of God, shows us the depth of God's love, even for the most undesirable people in our midst, by ministering to Naaman. A few verses before today's reading reveals that Naaman did not even believe that he could be healed in the muddy waters of the Jordan. Through Elisha we see the mystery of God when God bestows his saving grace on the lowly, and not on the kingly. The prophet's message was to trust in God's ways and do the unlikely things that God asks of us.

In today's gospel, ten lepers seek out Jesus and are cured of their leprosy. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to Jesus to give thanks to God. Jesus, like the prophet Elisha, ministers to society's outcasts, the lepers. Jesus cures the incurable. He brings those without hope back to the community. The message given to the people is very clear. God loves us with an unconditional love. God wants to give us His saving grace no matter how incurable our sins may seem. God wants us to reach out to the poorest of the poor and the outcasts of society.

Paul describes himself as a criminal and a prisoner in today's second reading. We hear that Paul was imprisoned because he preached the gospel of the risen Jesus. He preached, and thereby suffered, so that others could come to understand the good news and receive salvation. Though not a leper, Paul was nonetheless an outcast, a criminal in the eyes of many, and a prisoner in society. Sometimes we too need to follow the example of Paul and not only reach out to the outcasts of society, but also, if necessary, to **become** the outcasts for the salvation of others. That is not an easy thing to do, especially if we are too concerned about our self-image. May we all learn from today's readings and go forth with courage to bring God's mercy and healing to all we meet.

May your lives each day be filled with a thankful spirit.
