
Banns of marriage are announced for the second time for Kevin Holtz & Jody McDonnell, who will celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony here on October 28.

Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund"

Dear friends in Christ.

Peace be with you! Congratulations to Stephanie Wright, Daniel Perez and Mike Vrana who have been chosen and have accepted to serve a three-year term on the Pastoral Council. Thank you to Ken Loudermilk, Jacqueline Danek and Leo Bringman who have completed their three-year term. May God's blessings be upon you all.

This week we celebrate several important saints' days. Monday is St. Ignatius of Antioch, one of the most influential bishops in the first seventy years of the Church and also a martyr. Tuesday is St. Luke, the writer of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. Wednesday is Sts. John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, two important Jesuit priests who brought the Gospel to what is now upper New York and Canada and were killed there. Saturday is St. John Paul II, a pope of our time who led the fall to Communism and gave many people freedom to live their faith without fear.

How many of you always try to do things on your own without seeking anyone's assistance even though you know that with their assistance things would be much easier and smoother and would be accomplished sooner? I am sure that all of us act this way from time to time. We heard in today's first reading where Moses needed the help of Aaron and Hur as he prayed so that he would not tire out and that they would be victorious in battle. Even in our praying we need assistance from others. We hear this guite often spoken in Sacred Scripture. God reminds us that we cannot do it on our own. We need the help of others in praying and in living our life of faith. That is one reason Jesus calls us together each week as a community of faith, to support and encourage one another. Jesus knows what will happen to us if we try it alone. We will grow weary and we will fail and fall. St. Paul recognizes this in today's second reading as he says to Timothy: "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." How many of us live up to what St. Paul is saying? We oftentimes give in to fear and do not pass on the truth of our faith. We have to be like the woman in today's Gospel reading, we have to be persistent in living our faith and in our praying. The Gospel says that because of this woman's persistence the judge delivered a just decision for the woman. Notice that it doesn't say that the judge made a ruling in her favor, it only says that he gave her a just decision. That decision could have been in her favor or not in her favor. It depends on what would have been the just thing to do. God's justice knows no favorites. His justice will be delivered to all according to what is just. So, we must be persistent for God's justice to be done. We also need to pray for one another and assist one another so that we will be on the right side of justice. We must never grow weary, we must never give up. Persevere with courage and you will share in the salvation that our Lord Jesus Christ has won for you. Psalm 98 that we read at Mass today has been fulfilled. "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done wondrous deeds; his right hand has won victory for him, his holy arm...All the ends of the earth have seen that salvation by our God. Sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands: break into song; sing praise."

Don't forget to continue to pray for a greater respect for life, from the moment of conception to natural death, during this Respect Life month. And being the month of the Rosary, it would be good to offer your daily rosary for this intention. May our Blessed Mother Mary intercede for the lives of the unborn and may her prayers gain forgiveness for the horrible crimes being committed by the killing of babies in the wombs of their mothers through the procedure known as abortion.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen
