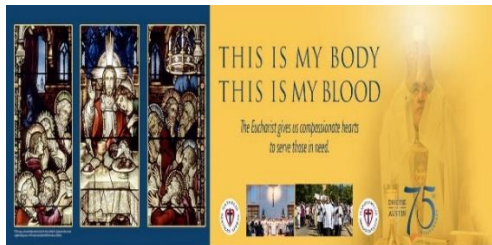

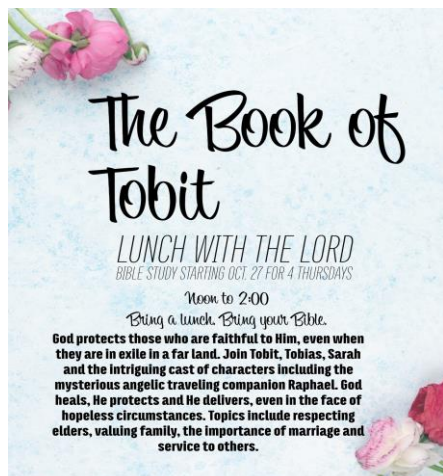

Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace to you all. We give thanks to God for the rain this past week and that no one was hurt in the storm. The month of November begins this week. There is much to prepare for as we enter into this festive time of year.

This weekend we have our annual Catholic Services Appeal. Most of you have received or will receive your pledge cards in the mail. Please complete the form making your pledge to the Diocese of Austin for this coming year and return the form by mail to the Diocese in the envelope that is provided in the mailing. If you have not made a pledge and would like to do so, we have extra pledge forms and envelopes available in the church. Please be good stewards and do your part in supporting the many ministries of the Diocese of Austin.

Tuesday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. Plan on attending Mass with our family. Mass will be at 7:00 am, 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm.

Wednesday, November 2, is All Souls Day. Mass will be at 7:00 am, 12:00 noon and 6:30 pm, so that you can come and pray for your loved ones who have died. During the month of November we pray for the souls in Purgatory, we pray for all those who have died and are on their way to Heaven. We pray that they may quickly pass through the purifying process in Purgatory and soon join the saints in Heaven. We do this because of what we read in Sacred Scripture in passages that pertain to the Church's teaching on Purgatory: Praying for and making an offering for the dead - 2 Maccabees 12:43-46; The need to make up for transgressions - Mt 5:25-26, Lk 12:58-59; nothing profane can enter heaven - Rev. 21:27; cleansing fire - 1 Cor 3:12-15; David, though forgiven, still punished for his sin - 2 Sam 12:13-14. Jesus paid the price for our sins in general, but we still must make up for the individual sins that we do. Let us pray that we can truly be one of those Holy Ones of God.

On Saturday, November 5, we will have out annual cemetery Mass at 11:00 am. Come and pray for all those who are buried in our cemetery.

In today's Gospel, we heard a story about Zacchaeus and how he had a restless heart. Last week we heard a parable about the tax collector who went into the Synagogue to pray and how he asked for God's mercy. Today we heard about the "chief tax collector", a person who was hated more than the regular tax collectors because he got most of the money that the other tax collectors had cheated from the people. Yet this little man was willing to make a fool of himself just so he could see Jesus. That's how restless his heart was, and it would not rest until it rested in being a follower of Jesus Christ. Notice that it was Jesus who reached out to Zacchaeus first and told him that He was going to stay at Zacchaeus' house. Zacchaeus accepted this offer of Jesus because he knew that there was something missing in his life, that his heart was not complete even though he had plenty of money. Just by hearing those words which Jesus spoke to him, Zacchaeus acknowledges the wrong he has done and seeks our Lord's forgiveness. Zacchaeus repents of his sins by giving half of his belongings to the poor and by paying back fourfold to anyone he has defrauded. Jesus accepts his offer and recognizes Zacchaeus as a true son of Abraham, his father and our father in faith. However, the Pharisees and the other people grumble and complain that Jesus is eating with a sinner. Notice how it was always the *sinner*s who recognized and accepted Jesus' offer to be His follower. Those who should have noticed Jesus for who He was could not. In a sense, the lost were being found and the so-called found were being lost. St. Augustine said, "Our hearts were made for Thee, O Lord, and they are restless until they rest in Thee." Is your heart restless as the heart of Zacchaeus or St. Augustine was? Jesus is saying to each of us, "I mean to stay at your house today." Are we willing to recognize ourselves as sinners and open our hearts to Jesus as Zacchaeus did in today's gospel? If we are, then Jesus will say to each of us: "Today salvation has come to this house, for this is what it means to be a son of Abraham." Go to Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Seek His forgiveness and mercy and may your heart rest in Him.

Křesťanství není náboženství uzavřené v malé skupině bránící se všemu novému. Naopak je misijním úsilím všech, kdo přijali Ježíše jako Pána svého života. Misie neoznačuje působení někde v exotické zemi. Je otevřením srdce pro ty, kteří jsou „jiní“. To proto, že Bůh miluje každého a hledá cesty, jak pomoci všem lidem otevřít oči pro Boží lásku.
