**Cedarbrake retreat** - The first annual Biblical Institute will be offered Jan. 6 - 8 at Cedarbrake Catholic Retreat Center in Temple. Begin the New Year learning about the great prophet Jeremiah who endured a life-long vocation of proclaiming demanding and often controversial messages from God. The complex and intriguing figure of Jeremiah, his times, his message, and their meaning for our day will be the subject of this three-day workshop led by Father Eric Wagner. #### Dear friends in Christ,

Merry Christmas! Thank you to everyone who helped to decorate the church last Sunday. Everything is certainly very beautiful. Thank you also to everyone who is singing and playing the organ or keyboard to help us to worship God and to give Him glory and honor. Your presence here brings much beauty to our celebrations.

Today we celebrate the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, God becoming man. What an awesome mystery it is for us to meditate upon. For us who believe, the Incarnation, God becoming man in Jesus Christ, brings much hope, joy, and peace into our lives. We are comforted by the reality that God would lower Himself to become human and allow Himself to be faced with all the dangers and difficulties which that entails. God did this so that we could experience the great love that He has for each one of us in a very intimate and profound way. God loves us so much that He sent His only Son as a sign of that love, as a gift to you and I. God allowed us to love Him in return which He experienced through the human nature of Jesus Christ. Just as any newborn baby attracts the attention of family and friends, the infant Jesus attracts our attention just as if He is being born again this very day. Just as Jesus called people to Himself as an infant, He continued to call people to gather around Him all throughout His life, as a child at the age of twelve in the Temple, and then in His adult years as He served His Father in His public ministry. People from miles around would gather to see Jesus and to hear the words He spoke. All people were in awe at these words and believed Jesus to be a holy man of God.

Today, Jesus continues to call us to Himself and He calls us to listen to His word. Jesus continues to call us to Mass so that we can listen to Him and receive His presence, His body and blood, soul and divinity, in the most holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. The Shepherds and the three Wise Men said "yes" to God by their going to Bethlehem after they heard the announcement by the Angels and followed the Star which led them to the birthplace of His Son Jesus. In the same way we say "yes" to God by coming to Mass on this Christmas Day and by coming to Mass every week of the year. We come because of the great love God has shown to us by giving us His Son that special night in Bethlehem. And like the Shepherds and the Wise Men we come to adore Him and worship Him. When we leave Mass on Christmas Day, I pray that we will have the same spirit of love and reverence for Christ all year long as we do today and that we will take this hope, joy, and peace to all people we meet each day.

Next weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, and New Year's Day. We will have an extra Mass at 11:30 p.m. on New Year's Eve and after Mass we will have our black-eye pea and combread reception in the PAC. Come and join us to pray-in the New Year and to share in fellowship with one another after Mass.

Also, any adult children who are living at home or living on their own and are working should have a set of envelopes.
