Friday, February 3, is the feast of St. Blaise. St. Blaise was a bishop in Sebaste in Armenia in the late 200's and early 300's. He was a very holy man. He was known for working several miracles to save the lives of people. One miracle was when he saved a boy from choking on a fish bone. No one could get the bone out but Blaise was able to save the boy's life. On the feast of St. Blaise it is our tradition to bless the throats of the faithful. We will have the blessings of throats on Friday evening, February 3, and then next weekend, February 4/5, at the end of Mass.

In today's Gospel we read the beatitudes, Jesus' instruction on how to live a joy-filled life that we find in the Sermon on the Mount in chapter 5 of the Gospel of Matthew. The beatitudes which Jesus offers us are a sign of contradiction to the world's understanding of happiness and joy. How can one possibly find happiness in poverty, hunger, mourning, and persecution? Being poor in spirit reminds us that true joy and happiness can only be found in God. Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness seek nourishment and strength in God's Word and Spirit. Sorrow and mourning over wasted life and sin leads to joyful freedom from the burden of guilt and spiritual oppression. God reveals to the humble of heart the true source of abundant life and happiness. Those who offer mercy and forgiveness to others will experience the mercy and forgiveness of God. Those who try to bring peace between peoples, without compromising the Truth, will experience the love and peace of God. Jesus promises his disciples that the joys of heaven will more than compensate for the troubles and hardships they can expect in this world. St. Thomas Aquinas said: "No one can live without joy. That is why a person deprived of spiritual joy goes after carnal pleasures." Is joy lacking in your life? Are you trying to find fulfillment in pleasures of the flesh and are only finding disappointment and emptiness? May we all try to live the spiritual joy that God offers us by being His faithful witness in the world. Live the Beatitudes and you will truly be blessed.
