The weather has been much warmer lately. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

### Dear Parishioners.

Peace be with you. We will be having our **Lenten Penance Service this Sunday, March 19, at 5:00 pm.** Five priests will be hearing confessions so take advantage of this opportunity and make a good confession before Easter. If you cannot make it to our Penance Service there are other parishes that are still having their Penance Service before Easter. So, be sure to check the bulletin for confession times at other parishes within our deanery.

Lent is quickly passing by and Holy Week will be here soon. Try to attend the Stations of the Cross every Wednesday at 6:30 pm, including during Holy Week. Some of you may already be making plans for Holy Week and Easter. Our schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows:

# Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m., Good Friday - 3:00 pm & 7:00 p.m., Holy Saturday - 8:15 p.m., Easter Sunday - 6:30 am, 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.

You may wonder why the Mass on Holy Saturday is so late in the evening. The Church states that we should wait until after sunset to light the Easter Fire. This way it is dark in the church and as we light the candles the light grows symbolizing the resurrection of our Lord.

The Easter Triduum during Holy Week is our most sacred and solemn week of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God.

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, April 2, following the 10:30 am Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after Mass on Holy Thursday. Altar Server practice for Holy Saturday will be at 11:00 a.m. on Holy Saturday. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them that they must attend the practice as scheduled for that particular day. Also please call Monica to let her know so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

In today's Gospel we have the story of Jesus healing the man born blind from birth. This event follows Jesus encounter with the woman caught in adultery and also several other encounters with the Pharisees. This discourse with the Pharisees is rather lengthy and during this discourse the jealousy of the Pharisees is made visible and they become angrier and angrier with Jesus. The healing of the blind takes place on the Sabbath day, a day when no one was to do any work. This action of Jesus is seen as he violating the Law concerning the Sabbath. The healing of the blind man also proves that his sins are forgiven, something which only God can do. Yet, Jesus in His humanity, heals and forgives sins. Jesus continues this action today through the actions of the priest in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). Maybe you can somewhat imagine the joy that the blind man must have experienced at being able to see for the first time in his life. You can also probably imagine the anger of the Pharisees because all of us have been jealous of others and angry at them at some time in our life. Maybe you still are today! All this anger continues to build each week as we approach Holy Week and the Pharisees begin to make plans to arrest Jesus and to have Him put to death. As we enter into these last weeks of Lent let us reflect on how our lives reflect that of the lives of the Pharisees and let us ask the Lord to open our eyes so that we can see clearly the things we need to change in our lives so that we can truly be the light of Jesus to one another.

May all of you continue to have a spiritually renewing Season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Palm Sunday and Holy Week, and, the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter.

Myšlenky: Dnešní evangelium mluví o velikém zázraku - o prohlédnutí člověka, který byl od narození slepý. Celé dějiny křesťanství však mluví o něčem mnohem větším, totiž o uzdravení člověka ze slepoty, ve které nevnímá nebo odmítá Spasitele - Ježíše. Kdyby šlo jen o medicínskou záležitost, sotva by si křesťané vybrali toto evangelium jako důležitý podklad pro závěrečné katecheze dospělých před jejich křtem. V tom evangeliu je totiž velmi názorně ukázáno, co může znamenat setkání s Ježíšem. Co může znamenat setkání, které je neseno vírou, setkání, ve kterém člověk přijme Ježíše bez předsudků. S takovým člověkem se stane něco, co nikdo nečekal a co je bezpochyby dobré - otevřou se mu oči víry. Slepý v evangeliu totiž neodchází od Ježíše jen jako ten, kdo vidí, ale jako ten, kdo v Ježíše věří. A to je něco ještě mnohem většího. Člověk sám ze sebe totiž nemá schopnost, se kterou by překonal slepotu hříchu, se kterou by překonal vzdálenost, která ho od Boha dělí. Nejde přece jen o to, aby člověk nějak pochopil, že existuje Bůh. Jde o to, aby mu uvěřil, aby mu porozuměl, aby se mohl rozhodnout žít s ním a udělat ho největší jistotou svého života. Aby prohlédl a přestal spoléhat na nespolehlivé a zdánlivé jistoty, aby prohlédl a neviděl sebe samého jako toho, kdo je nejdůležitější.

## Fourth Sunday of Lent: Jesus Heals

THE GRACE I SEEK: to believe that Jesus longs to bring me healing and strength

#### IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Jesus, the Lord of Life, has given himself to you in the Eucharist. He is gazing upon you, his beloved child. with great love at this very moment. Pause for a few moments and wonder at his gift for you. Allow yourself to rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to believe you are longing to transform my life with your healing.

**SCRIPTURE MEDITATION** — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"'Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance, but the LORD looks into the heart.' [...] Then Samuel, with the horn of oil in hand, anointed David in the presence of his brothers; and from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David." (1 Samuel 16:7b, 13a)

**REFLECTION QUESTION** — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Knowing that Jesus sees into the recesses of the heart, where in your heart is Christ's healing needed the most? Is there a place in your heart where you have never allowed the Lord to go? Ask Jesus for the grace to allow his spirit to "rush" upon that place to heal any wounds or sickness hidden there.

**SCRIPTURE MEDITATION** — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. [...] So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, 'He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see.'" (John 9:13, 15)

**REFLECTION QUESTION** — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Jesus, the Good Physician, knows our weaknesses of body, heart, and mind. He longs to heal us in ways we cannot imagine. Gazing upon the Eucharist, ask Jesus to help you "see" his providential care. Ask for the eyes to recognize his healing presence in your life, and thank him for this healing.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

**CLOSING PRAYER** — O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. (Collect, Fourth Sunday of Lent)

**SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION** — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire for spiritual healing.
