

Dear Parishioners.

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, the beginning of Holy Week. Thursday through Saturday of Holy Week are the most solemn days of our Church Liturgical Year. This is a very sacred time and we should set aside all other activities so that we are able to attend all of the Holy Week celebrations. In order to really experience the fullness of these days a person needs to attend every day as the theme of the Redemption is begun at the beginning of the The Sacred Paschal Triduum, Holy Thursday evening, which is actually the beginning of Good Friday, and ends with the triumphant conclusion upon the celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday. Our full attention should be given to celebrating these most sacred rites. Attending all of these special Services should take priority over any other event because celebrating Holy Week is what we are all about as a Catholic People. Let us do our best to show our love for our Savior by our faithfulness to these days. All of you should have made a good confession so that you are spiritually prepared to celebrate these holy days. If you have not had an opportunity yet to go to confession, I will be hearing confessions this week at various times. Please see this bulletin for the confession schedule. Also, St. William in Round Rock will have their Penance Service on Monday, April 3, from 1 – 6 p.m.

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the Triduum celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, April 2, following the 8:30 a.m. and the 10:30 a.m. Masses. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after Mass on Holy Thursday. Altar Server practice for Holy Saturday will be at 11:00 a.m. on Holy Saturday. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them that they must attend the practice as scheduled for that particular day. Also please call Monica to let her know so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

The youth of our parish will present outdoor **Stations of the Cross** this Wednesday, at 6:30 p.m. Please try to attend so that your experience of Holy Week can be all that it can be.

In today's Gospel we recall the event of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. Then, as we read the Passion, we hear about the arrest, suffering, crucifixion and death of Jesus. I would encourage you to spend some time today reflecting on these events and what meaning they have for you as you live your Christian faith.

Warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

The Novena of Divine Mercy begins this week on Good Friday. Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet everyday with your family or with another family or group of families until Divine Mercy Sunday. We will have a Divine Mercy Holy Hour on Sunday, April 16, at 3:00 p.m. Come and join us for this hour of prayer.

May all of you have a spiritually renewing Holy Week and a joyful celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday.

K ZAMYŠLENÍ: Když se čtou pašije, nejednou vyvstane otázka, zda Nebeský Otec skutečně opustil Ježíše, svého syna. Velké teologické téma má řadu praktických důsledků. Ježíš ve svém lidství neskutečně trpí pro strašlivou bolest způsobenou mučením, ale také jako druhá božská Osoba, která na sebe vzala důsledky lidského hříchu, což znamená oddělení se od Otce. Proto mluvíme o obrovské temnotě, do které Ježíš vstoupil, když na sebe vzal náš hřích. V tomto smyslu prožívá opuštěnost. Ale fakticky Otec prožívá Synovu oběť s velikou bolestí lásky. Otec je u kříže přítomen! Zároveň ale ví, že kříž není poslední krok této cesty. Zázrak vzkříšení je trumf, kterým je i Zlo zaskočeno. Ježíš na kříži cituje slova Žalmu 22, protože tento žalm výstižně zachycuje bolest trpícího, ale také důsledek vysvobození. Nejde tedy spíš o proroctví, které tu naznačil? Toto máme zakusit o Velikonocích! (Vira.cz)

Domingo de Ramos: Nuestro viaje cuaresmal encuentra su clímax en la celebración de la Semana Santa. Nuestra liturgia comienza con la entrada triunfal de Jesús en Jerusalén, pero la lectura de la Pasión nos invita a caminar con Jesús a través del sufrimiento y la muerte también. La promesa de Dios es la plenitud de la vida, pero con frecuencia en su lugar nos aferramos a las promesas vacías de la vida que el mundo ofrece: poder, fama y riqueza material ¿A qué debemos morir para vivir más completamente con Cristo y compartir su vida?

Palm Sunday: Setting Captives Free

THE GRACE I SEEK: to believe that Jesus will grant me true freedom

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Jesus, the Lord of Life, has given himself to you in the Eucharist. He is gazing upon you, his beloved child, with great love at this very moment. Pause for a few moments and wonder at his gift for you. Allow yourself to rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me believe that you will set me free.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"The LORD God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." (Isaiah 50:7)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

How have you felt misunderstood and judged—even by those closest to you, your own family? How have you been imprisoned by the words and deeds of others—and even your own words and deeds? How has sin played a role in this unfreedom? Speak to Jesus about this sin, suffering, and pain. Be honest about your experience with him, especially feelings of anger, shame, resentment, and abandonment.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3-4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

"Pilate said to them, 'Then what shall I do with Jesus called Christ?' They all said, 'Let him be crucified!' But he said, 'Why? What evil has he done?' They only shouted the louder, 'Let him be crucified!'" (Matthew 27:22-23)

REFLECTION QUESTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Jesus, the innocent Lamb of God, takes on the burden of our sin. Imagine how he felt as he heard the crowds shout mercilessly, "Let him be crucified!" Gazing upon Jesus in the Eucharist, allow yourself to enter into Jesus' experience of rejection and sorrow that he bore for your sin. Ask him to help you experience sorrow for your own sins and seek forgiveness, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Almighty ever-living God, who as an example of humility for the human race to follow caused our Savior to take flesh and submit to the Cross, graciously grant that we may heed his lesson of patient suffering and so merit a share in his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. (Collect, Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire for freedom from sin and shame.
