

A Message from Bishop Joe Vásquez - Brothers and Sisters, As we celebrate Father's Day, I pray that God will bless our biological and spiritual fathers. May our fathers and our priests continue to guide us ever closer to God as they follow the example of St. Joseph, a faithful husband to Mary and a caring and loving protector of Jesus. St. Joseph, pray for us! Amen.

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Thank you to everyone who helped out with the Corpus Christi Procession last Sunday. Thank you to those who set up the altars. Thank you to all who decorated and prepared the altars, and to all the children who brought flowers and prepared the way for the Lord. Your faith in the Real Presence, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is evident. I thank God for your strong faith and love that you have for Him.

Happy Father's Day to all of our faithful fathers! Today we honor you for your dedication to your wife and family. But, as you know, this honor is not something which comes freely, it is something which you earn. The best way to earn this honor is by living your life in the example of Jesus Christ. First of all, you must be holy. You must be a man of prayer, a man who goes to Church every week, a man who seeks God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a man who is obedient to God and to His Church, a man who makes a commitment and sticks to it. This is the beginning of being a good father. A father must be one who is loving and caring. One who truly listens with his heart. A man who is compassionate, kind and gentle. A father is a man who wants the best for his children and for his wife. He is a man who is not afraid to discipline his children and is a man who keeps his word, one who means "yes" when he says "yes" and one who means "no" when he says "no". He is a man who is willing to sacrifice his time, his work, and himself for his family. A father is a man who spends "time" with his family, not just "quality" time, but time in a quantitative sense as well. A father is a man who puts God first in his life and in the life of his family. He is a leader and a servant. A father is a man who is able to tell his children and his wife "I love you" and mean it from his heart, never taking it for granted believing that they already know, but expressing it from time to time. A father is a man who is able to ask for forgiveness from his wife and children and is a person who is able to say "I forgive you" when they ask for forgiveness. He is a man with a merciful heart. Are you this kind of father? This is a high standard to live up to, but it can be achieved, but as you know, it is not easy. Thank you for the father that you are to your family.

In today's Gospel Jesus says: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." After Jesus says this, He sends out his apostles to do what He was doing...curing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing lepers, driving out demons.... All of us are called to do the same. We are called to cure those who have become ill in their life of faith. We are called to cure them and bring them back to the Lord. We are called to go to those whose faith has died and to help them to come back to life in their Catholic Christian Faith. This must be done slowly and gently. We are called to cleanse those who have become stained by the filth of sin. To help heal their rotting souls and to bring them to new life. We are called to help drive out the demons from their life. To drive out the demons of rejecting the faith, the demons of pornography, unfaithfulness, masturbation, sodomy, contraception, selfishness, anger, hatred, pride, gossip, fornication, greed, envy, sloth, lust, gluttony, wrath and many other demons. As Jesus says, we are called to announce "the kingdom of God is at hand." All of us are called to announce The Kingdom to the world. However, God is calling others to a more intense proclamation of the Kingdom. He is calling men to the priesthood, men and women to religious life, to die to oneself and to give their life totally to Him. I believe every parish has people called to live the vocation of priesthood or religious life. We need to seek them out as a community of faith and encourage them to think and reflection upon the fact that God is calling them to this vocation in life. It has been about 60 years or more since anyone from this parish has been ordained a priest or entered religious life. That is too long. Please plant the seed in our young people today and encourage them to think about giving their life totally to God and to be of service to Him. Sometimes they only need a little encouragement or a little nudge to stir the spirit within them and for that spirit to come alive and give them the courage they need to say "yes" to God. Once they do say "yes" a whole new life begins, a life that is made whole and filled with God's grace and love. So, when you see someone in our parish or another parish that you believe would make a good priest or religious brother or sister, say something to them and get the spirit moving within them. "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."
