Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Summer begins this weekend and the summertime break for schools is about 1/3 completed. May all of our children enjoy the remaining summer break whether it be taking vacation with family or working on the farm or working around the house and yard or working at a local business.

Speaking of local business, please try to support our local businesses. Many are owned by our parishioners and they would appreciate your support. Most of what you need is available locally, whether it's tires, hardware and other home and garden needs, liquor, and the list goes on. Go and visit them and see what they have. You may be surprised.

I will be away the weekends of July 2 and July 9. Fr. Don Loftin will be here to celebrate Mass with you. On some of the weekdays that I am away seminarian Jeremy will have a Communion Service. Also, during my time away there will not be any confessions on Wednesday afternoon.

Today's readings speak to us about fear. We hear Jesus say "Fear no one." Whom do we fear? Or, what do we fear? And, why? Jesus tells us in today's Gospel, "And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." It seems in today's world people are afraid of the wrong thing. They fear this world, its violence, its challenges, unemployment, relatives and many other things. But, it seems that very few people fear what is important...and that is the reality of hell. In today's Gospel Jesus compares hell to Gehenna. Gehenna was a place outside ancient Jerusalem known in the Bible as the Valley of the Son of Hinnom. The Valley of Hinnom is the modern name for the valley surrounding Jerusalem's Old City, including Mount Zion, from the west and south. It meets and merges with the Kidron Valley, the other principal valley around the Old City, near the southeastern corner of the city. In the Bible, Gehenna was initially where some of the kings of Judah sacrificed their children by fire and was therefore a place deemed as being cursed. In Jewish Rabbinic literature, and Christian and Islamic scripture, Gehenna is a destination of the wicked. So, Jesus uses Gehenna as an analogy to describe hell and that this is what we should really fear. But, as Jesus tells us, "do not be afraid." If we are walking with Him and if we acknowledge Him before others Jesus tells us that He will acknowledge us before His heavenly Father. How do we acknowledge Him before others, by the way we keep His commandments and by the way we love one another. Living a life of faithfulness, i.e. going to Mass every week, being forgiving, praying, reading the Bible, living a moral life in all aspects including our sexuality, loving one another, this is how we acknowledge Him before others. As Christians we need to live our baptismal commitment and wear the white garment each and every day. When we do this it is then that we have nothing to fear.



May all of you have a most blessed week. Always remember, "be not afraid".
