

Dear friends in Christ.

May the peace and love of our Lord be with you all. Vacation Bible School begins today. Please pray for all the children who will be attending and pray for those who will be teaching them, for the cooks and for all who are helping. May God's love and grace be with them all.

This weekend we welcome Vít Mužný to our parish. As I mentioned in my note last week he will be here until August 22. May he have a wonderful stay here with us at Holy Trinity.

It is good to be home again after my two weeks in the Czech Republic. All priests who know you told me to say "hello" to you all. While I was there, I received the **Memorial Medal Award of the Czech Bishops' Conference** from the President of the Conference, Archbishop Jan Graubner, Archbishop of Prague, and Archbishop Jude Thaddeus Okolo, Papal Nuncio to the Czech Republic, for my work with the Transitional Deacons and the Priests of the Czech Republic and with the seminary. It was a great honor and a very humbling experience. The award was presented at the annual Sts. Cyril and Methodius Celebration in Velehrad with all the Bishops of the Czech Republic present and about 20,000 other people. The event was carried live on TV by Česká televise and TVNoe, the Catholic Television Station for the Czech Republic. To them I say "Thank you". And, thank you to all of you for your support of the Czech Seminarian Program.

In today's Gospel we hear the parable of the sower and the seed. Have you ever thought about what type of soil you are? Is your heart solid as rock, filled with arrogance and pride, so that when God's Word is sown upon you it only rolls right off and doesn't do anything? When we think we know everything and know better than God and His Church we are like the hardened path or the rocky soil where the seed falls, maybe it sprouts, but it soon withers and dies because it does not have anywhere to take root. Or, maybe our hearts are filled with thorns that choke off the Word of God. This happens when we mingle with the wrong people who could care less about God and His Commandments and we soon get overtaken by the thorns of evil and sin. This also happens when we let things like drugs, alcohol, internet, cell phones and certain relationships control us. God asks that we be like rich, fertile soil that allows His Word to sprout and take root and to grow. In order for us to be this kind of soil we must be humble, recognizing our dependence upon God. We must fertilize the soil through prayer, reading of God's Word, frequent Confession, and attending Mass. When we do this the seed will grow into what God wants it to be and then will produce much fruit, more than a hundredfold.

May all of you have a very blessed week.
