### Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Our Parish Bazaar is next Sunday. If you have not signed up to work please stop by the Raffle Table after Mass to sign up to work in the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success. We will need help also on Monday, September 18, to clean up and return everything to its proper place. Thank you to all of you.

This week we celebrate many feast days. Two of these are **The Exaltation of the Holy Cross** on Thursday, September 14, and **Our Lady of Sorrows** on Friday, September 15. It is through Jesus' death on the cross that salvation comes to us all. This feast day celebrates the finding of the true cross by St. Helena in the year 320 who was the empress of the time. This feast also celebrates the first church built over the empty grave of Jesus in the year 335. On the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows we remember the suffering Mary endured because of the cross of Jesus. Just as the prophet Simeon had foretold, a sword of sorrow would pierce the heart of Mary as she saw her Son, Jesus, die on the cross. Traditionally the "sorrows" of Mary number seven: 1) the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, 2) the flight into Egypt, 3) Jesus being lost in Jerusalem, 4) the meeting of Mary and Jesus on the way to Calvary, 5) the crucifixion, 6) the taking down of Jesus' body from the cross, 7) Jesus' burial. Mary can be of assistance to us in our times of sorrow. Ask Mary for her intercession to our Lord to assist you to overcome your times of sorrow and sadness so that you can rejoice with her in the new life Jesus promises to those who love Him.

According to today's readings, we have an obligation to lobby government for laws which are pro-life and for laws which are in line with Catholic teaching. This is because, as one of the works of mercy teaches, we are to admonish the sinner, we are to speak up when we see others do wrong and we are to try to correct them if possible, if they are willing to listen to us and accept our advice.

Jesus says today, "...tell the church" if something which is troublesome in life cannot find a resolution among the few who first consider it. Since the time of Jesus, government and religious leaders around the world have turned to the Church for light and guidance. Millions of Christians turn to the Church everyday seeking guidance and advice in regards to war and peace, marriage, racism, segregation, socialism and capitalism and many other issues. Because the Church is the Mystical Body of Christ on earth, it cannot turn away from the issues which concern all people of the world, issues which concern you and I in our daily lives.

In today's first reading the prophet Ezekiel carries a strong message from God to all of us about speaking out about sin and evil. He says that if we fail to call attention to the evil that a wicked man chases after, then we are also responsible for his downfall. We cannot sit back and do nothing, we must speak out and make others aware of their faults. We must do this out of love for them, a love founded and rooted in the love of Jesus Christ. Jesus' words in today's Gospel reading remind us that loving someone does not mean simply indulging them or turning a blind eye to their weaknesses. Where we see someone being harmed or harming themselves, we are not showing them love by remaining silent. Confronting them in a disapproving or patronizing way is not showing them love either. The challenge of today's Gospel is to treat others with respect and love even when they are doing what we believe to be wrong. Sometimes, though, this love may even mean not allowing them to receive the Sacraments of the Church in order to help them see the seriousness of what they are doing so that they may come to a conversion of heart and seek reconciliation with God and His Church. And this is what excommunication is all about.

Since the Church is the Body of Christ, it above all must speak up forcefully and accurately to us, the People of God, about our faith and morals -- and to all mankind about the morals of the natural law, written in the hearts of all people. It cannot remain silent in the face of wrongdoing, any more than a mother and father can be silent in the face of drugs, violence and sexual deviations infiltrating the lives of their children. The Church has an advantage in regards to these matters because the Church has the promise from Jesus Christ that the Holy Spirit will be with the Church giving it guidance and wisdom until the end of the world.

For our part let us stand steadfast with our Church when, through its rightful leaders, it speaks forth on faith and morals. For we know, by the words of Jesus, that the Church contains a wisdom and knowledge that we cannot individually obtain in our limited time on this earth. By listening to the voice of the Catholic Church, through which the Holy Spirit speaks to us, and by listening to the voice of the Spirit through prayer we will never be misled if we seek Jesus in complete honesty and faith.

**K ZAMYŠLENÍ:** Dnešní evangelium pokračuje ve výrocích o životě uvnitř církve. V řadě nejstarších rukopisů chybí slova "proti tobě". Nejde tu tedy pouze o komentář k řešení osobního sporu, ale o způsob, jak má vedení společenství pracovat s hříšníkem. Výrok: "ať je pro tebe jako pohan", zní značně vzdáleně Kristovým postojům. Jde zřejmě o náznak exkomunikace, tedy vyloučení ze společenství. Mluvíme tu o těch, kteří Pána chtějí následovat, ale jednají významně v rozporu s jeho učením. Pak dává smysl i slovo o svázání či rozvázání svěřující rozhodovací autoritu vedení církve. Odtud odvozujeme roli biskupů, resp. skutečnost duchovní autority. Vzápětí však navazuje text naznačující důležitost shromáždění nesoucích odpovědnost, tedy koncilů a synod. Slova "dostanou ji od mého nebeského Otce" jsou uvozena slovesem znamenajícím obecně "stát se, nastat". Asi jde o narážku na nutnost jednoty v rozhodování. Tehdy Pán slyší, stojí za církví a naplní její prosby. Vedení tak není věcí jednoho člověka, ale společného rozhodnutí, jak naznačují následující výroky v 18. kapitole. (Vira.cz)
