Holy Trinity Catholic Church hosts in Partnership with Elite Medical Imaging, their annual Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 21, 2023</u>. Screenings will be done in the RE Bldg, Meeting Room, by appointment only. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: carotid artery, abdominal aorta, thyroid, liver, spleen, gallbladder and both kidneys. These screenings are not typically done at physician's visits or at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered to you for \$60 each or the full preventive package, (all 8 areas) for just \$170.00! Flex spending and Health Savings accounts may be used to pay for these screenings the day of service, as well as cash and all major credit/debit cards. Our radiologist team

recommends these screenings be considered on an annual basis as a preventive measure. Oftentimes results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors, family history and lifestyle. A representative from EMI will be at Holy Trinity at all weekend Masses of <u>October 14/15</u> to offer pre-registration and answer any questions you may have. #### Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Thank you to all of you who worked to make our Parish Bazaar a great success. The meal was absolutely delicious. The weather cooperated to give us a beautiful day and everyone seemed to have a very enjoyable day. May God's blessings be upon all of you for all you have done for your parish and for our Lord.

This week we celebrate the feast day of a few well known saints. Tuesday - Sts. Cosmas and Damian; Wednesday - St. Vincent de Paul; Thursday - St. Wenceslaus and St. Lawrence Ruiz & Companions; Friday - Sts. Michael, Gabriel & Raphael, Archangels; Saturday - St. Jerome. May we follow their example in living our life of faith and may they intercede and pray for us.

In today's Gospel is the parable about the workers in the vineyard. Some were hired early in the day, some later. At the end of the day they all received the same pay. In the preceding section of scripture the disciples ask about their reward for the sacrifices they made to follow Jesus. And following this parable the mother of James and John asks Jesus for special places of privilege for her two sons. Jesus is troubled by people trying to get a position, trying to be first in line when the blessings are distributed. So He responds, *"The first will be last, and the last will be first."* In other words, Jesus turns such speculation around. In things of this world it may sound like good business to try for first place. But the philosophy of "look out for yourself" and "the early bird gets the worm" is not the way the Kingdom of God works, according to Jesus.

So He drives home the point with the story of the farm laborers. Some of them labor for twelve hours, others only work nine or six or three hours. Those who were hired later were very fortunate to have gotten hired for any work that day. But the farmer in today's story kept going back for more workers. And when he pays them, he pays those who came last, first, and the same amount as the others who had worked all day. Probably those who worked all day thought they would get twice as much. How could he pay them the same amount? Though they were hired for this sum, and though they were grateful for a job when they were hired, that gratitude evaporated under the hot sun of their envy. So they say, *"Master, you are not fair!"* 

Today's parable, though, is not about fairness, but about the generosity of God. Like the farmer in Jesus' story, God can spread generosity with surprise any time He wants to. He will not give less than He promised. No one will be cheated by God. But He might just give more than He promised. This unpredictable outrageous generosity of God strikes you differently depending on where you are standing in line. But you can be sure of this, when we line up before God on that final payday, you will be glad just to be in a line where you will receive just what God has promised you. And I do not believe that you will want to get out of that line.

Let us be a people that is thankful for everything we receive, no matter how little or how much it may seem to be here on earth, for our reward will be great in heaven, more than any of us can imagine, and all of us will want to accept the fairness of God and not care who is first or who is last in His Kingdom. We will just be glad to be there.

May all of you have a most blessed week filled with the abundant generosity of God.

Pokud se na text díváme z našeho pohledu, stojí za otázku, zda jsme připraveni vstoupit do Boží služby kdykoli. A podobně, nakolik sami dokážeme vnímat svět perspektivou dobra pro druhé. Poslední zamyšlení se může týkat těch, kteří třeba léta necítili žádné povolání pro Boha. Pán nás ale někdy osloví až na úplném konci např. školy, rodičovství, práce nebo i života.
