Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Today we celebrate the feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday of our Church year. Today, in a very special way, the Church presents Jesus as our King and Lord who was and is the visible presence of God in our midst. The first reading presented God as a shepherd reminding us of Jesus' claim that He is the true Shepherd. In the second reading today, St. Paul tells us that Christ is the all-powerful ruler who raises the dead and to whom every other power and authority must eventually give way. And today's Gospel tells us of Christ the King coming in heavenly glory to judge us, based on how we have shared our love and blessings with others through our acts of charity. In today's Gospel we read of how Jesus is not only the Shepherd who leads, feeds and heals his sheep, but He also dwells in those for whom we care. In this parable of the sheep and the goats and the last judgment, every person to whom we assist, "whether hungry, thirsty or a stranger, naked, sick or in prison," is revealed to us as having been the risen Jesus. Matthew tells us that our reward and punishment depends on how we have treated the risen Jesus in those who are in need and how faithful we have been in giving witness to His Teachings.

All of us, by virtue of our baptism, are called to be witnesses of the presence of the Kingdom. We are called to unite in order to stop the decline of religious belief and the erosion of morality in the world. In doing so we are soldiers for Christ. Our battlefield is in the home, the school, the place of employment, the neighborhood and town in which we live, and the parish. We must take the opportunities provided to us to stand up for what is right and defend the truth of Jesus Christ our King by living lives of virtue, love and service. To ensure that Jesus is always the King of our heart and lives requires of us a great commitment, sacrifice, conviction, hard work and much prayer. May we all truly have Jesus Christ as the King of our lives and may we all live as His faithful servants so that we may be counted among the saints in Heaven.

On the Solemnity of Christ the King I encourage you and your family to re-dedicate yourself to Jesus Christ the King by saying this prayer together:

Act of Dedication of the Human Race to Jesus Christ the King

Loving Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us as we kneel before you on this feast day. We belong to you and we wish always to be yours. In order that we may be more closely united with you, each one of us freely consecrates himself today to your most Sacred Heart.

We pray, Lord, that you will be king, not only of the faithful ones who have never abandoned you, but that you will be King also of those who have abandoned the faith. We pray especially for them, that they may soon return to their Father's house and to their Father's love. We pray also that you will be King of those who are kept away from the church because of false opinions or misunderstandings. Call them back, Lord, to the truth and unity of the faith, so that soon there may once again be one flock and one Shepherd.



Ale poslední Kristovo veřejné vystoupení v Matoušově evangeliu je momentem slavnostním. Musí to pochopit každý, nikdo se nemůže vymlouvat.
