

Advent is upon us - a time to prepare our hearts for the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and his return at the end of time. The penitential nature of the season of Advent allows us time to reflect on our personal weaknesses that prevent us from fully encountering Christ. During Advent, in listening to God's word, in the hymns we sing, and in the prayers we offer, we focus our attention upon the birth of the Savior who is coming. Let us embrace this sacred time so that God's graces penetrate our minds and hearts knowing that Christ is found in the Holy Eucharist and is always near.

#### Dear friends in Christ.

Here we are already on the Third Sunday of Advent. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice! The Lord is near!" (Philippians 4:4,5) This verse, taken from today's entrance antiphon, expresses the theme of this Sunday's readings and the reason we call this Sunday "Gaudete Sunday".

This year the Season of Advent is only three weeks and a day. So, we are already past the midway point preparing ourselves for the great event -- the birth of the Son of God, Jesus Christ. For all of us there are many preparations to be made. It requires a lot of time and energy to be spent generously and wholeheartedly if it is to be a successful event. We accept the work and sacrifices with a spirit of joy in anticipation of the happy event.

Advent gives us a chance to take the necessary steps to prepare for the birth of the Lord, the Son of God. Besides preparing materially for the birth of the Lord, we also need to spend time and energy to prepare our own heart to be ready to welcome the newborn infant on Christmas morning.

We sometimes think of Advent as a time for prayer and sacrifice, just as we do during the Lenten Season. However, there is a major difference in that our prayer and sacrifices are grounded in a deep sense of hope. It is the realization that soon the Creator of the Universe will humble Himself to share in our humanity. In joyful anticipation we look forward to the coming of the Savior.

How are we preparing ourselves for this great event? We turn to the prophet John the Baptizer who admonished the people to turn aside from their sins, repent, and be cleansed in the waters of baptism. All of John's preaching reflected back, not on himself, but on Jesus. John said, "There is one among you whom you do not recognize...whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." It is to this exalted One, Jesus our Lord, whom we turn to for forgiveness and reconciliation. All of us have this opportunity to be reconciled with God and with His Church by going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Listed in this bulletin are the remaining Penance Services in our Deanery. So, be sure to make a good confession before Christmas.

Also, this season calls us to be of service to others, joyfully and generously. This is a challenge for us today. We need to minister, not for our own glory and honor, but as a means of reflecting God's love in our lives by what we say and do. In today's first reading Isaiah describes his mission as service to his people. He was to bring glad tidings to the lowly, to heal the brokenhearted, proclaim freedom to the captives and release to prisoners. Isaiah's mission was to be of service to others.

Paul told the Thessalonians how they should prepare while they are waiting for the Lord to come. He instructed them to be waiting in hopeful and joyful expectation as he says, "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus". He knew that lives, lived in hope and love, would give peace and joy in this world, and would grant everlasting happiness in the next.

While we are waiting, let us take to heart the advice that John the Baptizer gave to the people of his day. We are to make straight the way of the Lord in our hearts and in our daily lives by examining our conscience, resolving to do better, and repenting of our sins. By doing this, Christmas will have a special meaning for us, one that will continue throughout our lives and we will be properly prepared to meet our Lord, Jesus Christ.

For those of you who are counting, next Sunday's Mass does not fulfill your Christmas obligation and the Christmas Masses do not fulfill your obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. So, you need to go to the weekend Mass and the Christmas Mass to be faithful to God and to His Church.

May the joy of this season be in your heart and soul.
