Dear friends in Christ.

I hope all of you have had a wonderful Christmas Season which will end this Monday, January 8, when we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. I hope you have kept your Christmas lights shining until the end of this Season. On Tuesday, January 9, we will begin the First Week in Ordinary Time.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Some of you may be wondering why Herod would be worried about a baby boy taking over his kingdom. The first century historian, Josephus, tells us that Herod the Great was a bit paranoid, and as a result was quite cruel. Herod continuously imagined or saw conspiracies against his authority and executed numbers of his ranking citizens, including five of his ten wives and even some of his own children. This is the kind of man which the Magi, Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar, encountered as they asked for directions to the place of the newborn king of the Jews. Knowing this helps us to see that God's love could be offered in such a volatile environment.

The Magi represent all of us and it is important that we ponder their pilgrimage. The journey which they made to Bethlehem from their homelands was not an easy one. They encountered strange languages and customs, and they did not have a reliable map. Extensive travel in the first century was not an easy thing to accomplish, and their willingness to make and complete the journey is an indication of the great importance they placed on it and their commitment to it.

Another thing characteristic of the Magi that emerges is their openness, their willingness to seek out what they do not yet fully understand, and to embrace it once it is discovered. Just imagine, how many of us would have gone on such a journey knowing little about what we were seeking. There were also costs associated with the journey of the Magi. Not merely the costs of the voyage itself, but also the costs of the gifts which were the most exotic and costliest gifts available. They gave so much. Do we tend to be so generous?

Why did they go through all this trouble to take such a journey? They wanted to see the Lord, to gaze upon the One who came to be the world's hope. Just consider the means that God selects to make this manifestation of Himself. He calls the Magi from within the midst of what was most familiar to them--their own professions. An ancient astrologer should not be confused with those who bear the name today. These were primitive astronomers, searching the heavens for truth. But that truth did not come to them merely through their own efforts. It came through the prompting, leading, and protection of the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus would later say, leads us into all truth.

In this sacred season of Christmas, let us ponder anew the significance of this story of the Magi. Let us remember that there are two ways in which we may search for Jesus. We may search for Him as did the wise men of old, with commitment, openness, and generosity. Or, we may seek Him out as did Herod, with a paranoid suspicion that He may displace us from the feeble thrones we have erected for ourselves. We may seek Him with the guestion: What will He take from me? Or, with the guestion: What may I offer Him?

It is the tradition that on the Feast of the Epiphany that we bless our homes by marking them with blessed chalk with the current year and the initials of the Three Wise Men -- Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, CMB, or, KMB in Czech, and these letters also stand for the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat", which means "May Christ bless this dwelling". On the back of this bulletin you will find the blessing prayer and instructions on how to mark your homes. Mark your home above the front door so that all may know that your home is a Christian home.

Confessional - You may have noticed the two lights on the new confessional. If the green light is on it means that a priest is in the confessional. If the red light is on it means that someone is making their confession so do not enter. There is no need to ask if I am there when the green light tells you this already.

May God bless all of you this year with a strong faith and with an awareness of His love for you.

K úvaze: Boží slovo o Slavnosti Zjevení Páně se zcela zaměřuje na Ježíše jako na Mesiáše, krále a spasitele všech národů. On nepřišel pouze pro izraelský národ, ale také pro pohany – pro celé lidstvo. Duch svatý způsobuje, že tato setba dozrává, a církev má v hojnosti sklízet plody této setby, kterou Ježíš zasel svým zjevením a oživil svou smrtí.

V Ježíši mohou všichni lidé najít pravou jednotu a objevit, že plnost života znamená dát se do služby Kristu a bližním. Našim posláním je tedy milovat a zůstávat v jednotě. (Pastorace.cz)

Epiphany House Blessing

Using blessed chalk,
mark the current year and the initials of the
Magi above the outside doorways to your home.
Place a cross in between each of the letters.
It should look something like this.

$$20+C+M+B+24$$

After completing the above markings, pray the following prayer:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord of all people forever and ever. Amen.

The legendary names of the three Magi are: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. (KMB in Czech)

The initials C-M-B also stand for the Latin words "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means:

"May Christ bless this dwelling."

The markings over the doors should be left all year round as a sign that yours is a Christian home.
