Dear friends in Christ.

We have now returned to the Season of Ordinary Time in which we focus upon the not so ordinary life and ministry of Jesus. In today's Gospel John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God to his disciples who in turn went to see and listen to Jesus. These disciples responded to Jesus' invitation to come and see. Today's Gospel does not tell us specifically what they saw or what Jesus told them, but we know that they did eat with Jesus and listened to what He had to say. The Gospel does show us that they came to understand they had found the Messiah. The actions of these disciples, and Simon Peter also, give the impression that they were awaiting God's call. The Psalmist today best describes their attitude: "I have waited, waited for the Lord..." Once they heard God's call, their response was immediate. They wasted no time pursuing John's tip about the Lamb of God, and in responding to the invitation from Jesus to come and see.

We see the same response from Samuel in today's first reading, except Samuel seems a little more confused. Samuel was waiting in the temple, keeping a time of vigil, so he even had to sleep in the temple. Samuel was "waiting, waiting for the Lord." After Samuel finally figures things out he responds: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." We can learn from young Samuel that we, too, need to listen to God. We also, need to be patient and listen to God speaking to us in many different ways and then respond by saying: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." Then when we have done this, we can follow our Lord and serve Him in whatever vocation He is calling us to in life or has already called us to and which we are currently living.

In today's second reading St. Paul tells us that by God's grace we became members of Christ when we responded with our free will to Christ's invitation to "come and see." Since we are members of Christ, are we listening to Him as His disciples did, and as Samuel did to God? If we listen to Jesus we will recognize Him as the Messiah and follow Him and serve Him. Samuel and the disciples responded with enthusiasm to their calling. I pray that all of us will respond with the same enthusiasm and live out our vocation in life whether it be marriage, priesthood, religious life, or single life, in true service to our Lord.

Next weekend we celebrate **Called by Name Sunday** here in the **Diocese of Austin**. Please take time to think of people from our parish who you think have the gifts needed to be a priest or a religious brother or sister. We will have cards available in the pew next weekend for you to write their names on and submit to the diocese. You may also want to encourage them personally to think about the priesthood or religious life. Let them know that you see something within them and that God may be calling them to one of these vocations. Please join us for a **Holy Hour of Prayer for vocations next Sunday**, **January 21**, **at 4:00 pm**. Let us pray for men and women to respond to God's calling them to a religious vocation.

Jan Křtitel tak jednoznačně poukazuje na Ježíše jako na někoho, kdo vysvobodí Izraele za cenu vlastního obětování. A učedníci to okamžitě pochopili. Až komicky působí jejich první rozhovor s Ježíšem. Jako by vlastně nevěděli, co mu říci. Co bychom říkali my Pánu, který se za nás obětuje? Teď tu stojí před námi a nám chybí slova. Není z toho patrná nesmírná osobní blízkost Boha k člověku? Je doslova na dotek! (Vira.cz)
