#### Dear Parishioners,

Peace be with you. Thank you to everyone who helped to cover the statues. They really add to the solemnity of these holy days. Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, the beginning of Holy Week. **Thursday through Sunday of Holy Week are the most solemn days of our Church Liturgical Year. This is a very sacred time and we should set aside all other activities so that we are able to attend all of the Holy Week celebrations.** In order to really experience the fullness of these days a person needs to attend every day as the theme of the Redemption is begun at the beginning of the Sacred Paschal Triduum, Holy Thursday, and ends with the triumphant conclusion upon the celebration of Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord. Our full attention should be given to celebrate these most sacred rites. All services should take priority over any other event because celebrating Holy Week is what we are all about as a Catholic people. Let us do our best to show our love for our Saviour by our faithfulness to these days. All of you should have made a good confession so that you are spiritually prepared to celebrate these holy days. I will be hearing confessions at various times during this week. Please see the schedule in this bulletin.

Our youth will present outdoor Live Stations of the Cross this Wednesday, at 6:30 p.m. Please try to attend so that your experience of Holy Week will be all that it can be.

We will be having **Altar Server practice** for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday, on Palm Sunday, March 24, following the 10:30 am Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after the evening Mass on Holy Thursday. Practice for Holy Saturday will be on Holy Saturday at 11:00 a.m.

Today we recall Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem as He rides a donkey, an animal that represented peace, and the people lay palm branches along his path and sing "Hosanna", which comes from Hebrew meaning "save now". It is a cry for salvation. We hear this act of salvation being brought to fulfillment as we read the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ in today's Gospel. Today we prepare ourselves for the celebrations of this Holy Week and we reflect upon Jesus' suffering and death. So quickly the people turn against Jesus. We oftentimes do the same thing. We are faithful to our Lord, but, all of a sudden, we turn against Him by living a life of sin and we no longer want to be near Him. May we have the courage to admit when we have done wrong and seek union with God and once again declare Jesus and our King and Lord.

Good Friday marks the beginning of the **Divine Mercy Novena**. Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily and experience the mercy of God. We will have our Divine Mercy Devotion on Sunday, April 7, Divine Mercy Sunday, at 3:00 pm. This devotion will consists of the blessing of the image of Divine Mercy, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Divine Mercy Litany, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend.

Warmer weather has arrived. Usually when spring and summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

May all of you have a spiritually renewing Holy Week and a joyful celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter Sunday. **Fr. Stephen Nesrsta, farář**
