Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Please pray for those who will receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion next Sunday. May they always have a desire to receive Him often.

Come and join us for our **Family Fun Day** today. Whether you are just one or whether you are ten in your family, all are invited no matter the age.

Jesus tells us in today's gospel that He is the Shepherd and that we are the sheep. For us to appreciate and understand the wonderful imagery in today's gospel, we must try to understand the qualities of sheep and the qualities of the shepherd. These images are used by Jesus many times to describe our relationship with him. Sheep are known to be obstinate, so are we. They see something they want and they go after it without paying attention to the dangers along the way. So do we, whether we are teenagers or adults. Sheep are finicky and yet playful; independent yet often following with the herd, kind of fits us too doesn't it? Sheep are easily frightened, but above all, they are vulnerable creatures and easy to love. Probably, most of us are also. They are, however, easily run down, trapped, and killed by predators. It seems that the devil is having an easy time doing this to a lot of people in today's world.

These are some of the very same qualities Jesus used to describe who we are in relation to Him. We, too, are independent and yet follow the crowd, finicky and playful, determined and frightened, lovable and very vulnerable. We are so vulnerable to the evils which seek to possess and destroy us, but yet we seem to deny that this is true, which makes it easier for the devil to control us.

As we all know, a shepherd guards and guides his sheep, not only away from danger, but toward nourishment. He protects the sheep with his very life. He knows his sheep and they know his voice. It is a voice which calls them forth from amongst all others to be with their shepherd. He cares for the sick sheep and searches for those who are lost. Jesus, himself, comes to take on the role of shepherd to us. He comes with full knowledge of us. He knows how we will act and react. He knows our weaknesses and vulnerabilities. But above all, He loves us.

These beautiful qualities can easily be seen in Peter's proclamation of Jesus to the leaders and elders in today's first reading. Through the power of the Good Shepherd, healing and care is poured out upon the children of God. Jesus gave His life for us. He is the center of our lives. The entire life and mission of Jesus can be seen in and through the image of the Good Shepherd and His sheep.

Our celebration of the Paschal Mystery and Easter gives us a time and setting to reflect upon images which can deepen our relationship with Christ. We are called to be the sheep, the followers, who recognize and respond to the voice of Christ. We accept His guidance and nourishment. We rejoice that He gave His life for us. We know by the resurrection that He is still present to us as our Good Shepherd. Through this image Jesus seeks to give us comfort and peace, strength and hope. Throughout His words and examples of Scripture, Jesus reminds us, "I am the Good Shepherd, I know my sheep and my sheep know me." Do we recognize the voice of Jesus and follow Him or have we begun to stray?
