

The **Cemetery Committee** will meet this Thursday, June 6, at 6:30 p.m. in the RE Bldg. All parishioners are invited to attend.



Dear friends in Christ.

Praised be Jesus Christ! We welcome all visitors who are with us this Sunday for our June Fundraiser. May you experience the presence and love of Jesus Christ during this Mass. Thank you for joining us and we hope you will enjoy the meal and the music today.

Many people are beginning their summer vacations. Always remember to take a nice set of clothes along with you so that you will be properly dressed for Mass wherever you go. Please do not attend Mass in shorts if you are more than 6 years of age. Check ahead of time to locate the Catholic Church and find out the Mass times so that you will be on time for Mass. You can find the Mass times for almost every parish by going to **www.masstimes.org** or by using their App on your smartphone. It is important that we do not neglect our worship of God and that we keep His Commandment to keep Holy the Sabbath Day.

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Since the time of the Apostles the Church has believed and taught that Jesus is present, body and blood, soul and divinity, in the Holy Communion that we receive at Mass. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus during the consecration in the Eucharistic Prayer. The appearance remains the same, but the substance changes. This is not a symbolic presence, but, it is the REAL PRESENCE of Jesus. That is why we take such care of the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist, and offer to the Real Presence of Jesus our Adoration and Praise. That is why we have our annual Corpus Christi Procession to give a more public sign of our belief in this Real Presence. The early Church Fathers wrote about this presence, as did St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 10:16–17, 11:23–29). May we all be careful of how we speak about the Holy Communion that we receive at Mass. We should speak of it as the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ, not bread and wine. We pray that one day all Christians will once again believe what the Apostles and the early Church believed about Jesus' Real Presence in Holy Communion.

Next Saturday, June 8, Matthew Jewell will be ordained a priest. Please pray for him as he is consecrated to be a priest of Jesus Christ and His Church. May the Holy Spirit be with him to give him all the strength, wisdom and knowledge needed to minister to God's people.

Beginning with the first weekend in August our new Mass schedule will be as follows: Saturday, 5:00 pm, Sunday, 7:30 am, 9:30 am and 11:30 am. Mark your calendars and plan now to adjust your schedule to fit with this new Mass schedule.

Eucharistie nás udržuje při životě: Eucharistie je pokrmem pro ty, kdož byli křtem osvobozeni z otroctví a stali se dětmi; pokrmem, který člověka udržuje při životě během jeho dlouhého exodu pouští lidské existence. Stejně jako mana pro lid Izraele, je také eucharistie pro každou křesťanskou generaci nepostradatelnou potravou, která nás provází na cestě pouštěmi světa, vyprahlého působením ideologických a hospodářských systémů, které život nepodporují, ale spíše ponižují; světa, v němž převládá logika moci a majetku nad logikou služby a lásky. Světa, v němž nezřídka dominuje kultura násilí a smrti. Avšak Kristus nám přichází vstříc a dává nám jistotu: "On sám je "chlebem života". (Pastorace.cz)

Prayer for Corpus Christi

Most Holy and Almighty God, we thank you and praise you for giving us the most precious body and blood of Your only son, Jesus Christ. Through the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion, we are able to nourish our bodies and souls. We thank you for having made Yourself our food and for uniting us with You in this beautiful Sacrament. Amen.

What is the Corpus Christi procession?

Whenever the Eucharist is exposed for adoration of the people, it is placed in a sacred vessel called a Monstrance, whose clear glass permits the viewing of the Sacred Host. Such Exposition can take several forms, on the altar in a parish, for adoration and prayer, public devotions such as Eucharistic Benediction, and public processions on Corpus Christi, or at other times. In Catholic countries such processions often go throughout the city. The faithful usually sing and pray, all in honor of our Eucharistic King. This practice began in the 14th-century, and it has been promoted by popes, councils, and saints as a wonderful way to show the supreme importance of the Eucharist and the love that we have for Him.

Why do Catholics celebrate Corpus Christi?

The Catholic Church honors Christ's Presence in the Holy Eucharist with a special feast owing to St. Juliana of Liège, a 13th-century Norbertine canoness from Belgium. She had a great love for the Eucharist. When she was 16, she had a vision in which the Church was a full moon with a dark spot. The dark spot signified that the Church was missing a feast dedicated solely to the Body and Blood of Christ. Even though she had this vision several times, St. Juliana didn't think that she could do anything to help institute this feast. Therefore, she kept it a secret for many years. Once she was elected prioress, she finally told her confessor, who in turn told the bishop. This eventually led to the universal feast of Corpus Christi.

What does Corpus Christi mean?

The Latin words "Corpus Christi" translate to "Body of Christ."

Why is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi important?

The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Second Vatican Cuncil, *Lumen gentium*, no. 11). In the Eucharist, Jesus Himself re-presents for our benefit His Sacrifice on Calvary (Luke 22:19-20; 1 Cor. 11:26-29), gives Himself to us in Holy Communion (Exodus 16:4, 35; John 6:1-14, 48-51), and remains among us until the end of the age (Luke 24:13-35; Mt. 28:18-20). He comes to us in this humble form, making Himself vulnerable, out of love for each one of us. Yet, as God Himself, the Body and Blood of Christ deserves our utmost respect and love, as well as our adoration. St. Thomas Aquinas, Hymn "Tantum Ergo" Down in adoration falling, Lo! the sacred Host we hail; Lo! o'er ancient forms departing, Newer rites of grace prevail; Faith for all defects supplying, Where the feeble senses fail.

St. Francis of Assisi said, "...In this world I cannot see the Most High Son of God with my own eyes, except for His Most Holy Body and Blood."
