Dear friends in Christ,

May the love of our Lord be with each of you. Mark your calendars for Sunday, August 18. Bishop Joe Vásquez will be here to celebrate the 11:30 am Mass. After Mass he will bless the new grotto to Our Lady of Hostýn. Everyone is invited for the Mass and blessing.

In today's gospel Jesus brings calm to the storm. The disciples tell Jesus, before He calms the storm, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" After Jesus calms the storm He asks the disciples, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" We, like the disciples, are terrified when there is a storm in our life, whether it be a storm caused by the weather, or another kind of storm, like illness, disease, physical disability, injury, divorce or other crisis. Sometimes we create our own storms in life and then blame everyone else for them. If we could live our life in complete faithfulness to Jesus and His Church we could avoid most of these storms. Many storms are caused by the decisions that we make in life because we make them not with sound judgment, but, we make too many decisions based on our feelings and emotions. Usually these decisions do not turn out very good. No matter how the storm in our life may have begun we often ask, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus always asks the Father to give us what we need to handle these storms in our life. May we always put our faith and trust in Him, know that He is with us. By putting it all in His hands we can live through these storms in calm and in peace even though our feelings and emotions my try to tear us apart. Ask our Lord to help you have the peace and calm you are seeking.

A few weeks ago, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, I spoke about how we should try to show proper respect and reverence when we come to Mass. That is why we ask you to make sure you are properly dressed, no shorts or torn blue jeans or other torn slacks. When you come to Mass you should never come late, you should come early to spend some time in prayer before Mass. Also, you should never leave Mass early, unless you are doing something for God here at the church, or if you have become ill. So, you should stay until we have prayed the final prayer after the recessional song. Thank you for being a people of faith who care about the way you worship our Lord.

Also, we ask that you are careful when you come to receive Holy Communion. Make an altar for the Lord with your hands or receive the host on your tongue. If receiving on the hands, do not grab the host. You are to receive it in the palm of your hand. If you wish to receive kneeling, then you should kneel at the Communion rail. If you are carrying a baby or small child, you should receive on the tongue. That is why I say "receive on the tongue please". So, don't get offended when I or, one of the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, ask you to do so. All these suggestions or guidelines are meant to help you think of Who it is you are receiving and to show proper respect to Him.

May all of you have a most blessed and week. Stay cool!
