

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! In our first reading today we hear God tell Ezekiel that he is going to be sent to the Israelites because they have rebelled against God. Ezekiel was the first prophet to receive the call to prophesy to the people in Babylon. His mission was to prepare the people for their re-entry into Jerusalem. He prophesied about their past sins and about their lack of obedience to the covenant and the majesty of God. Ezekiel spoke of the Temple and of proper worship of God. And like most prophets, Ezekiel message was not readily accepted. Just like the message Jesus spoke in His hometown. And the same is true today.

Many people refuse to listen to the Church's teachings and proclamations concerning abortion, birth control, the death penalty, living in homosexual relationships, sex before marriage, euthanasia, the economy, immigration, and the list goes on. People of today believe that there are not any absolute truths. Whatever they want to believe or want to agree with is the only thing that is true for them. The Church's teachings on a few things of which I have listed are **absolute truths**. And the same is true with the other teachings of the Church such as the Real Presence of Jesus in the bread and wine that we use at Holy Communion. Jesus is present whether we believe it or not. It is an **absolute truth** of our faith. God has given us the Church through Jesus Christ to proclaim the truth to all nations. Yet this truth is not always accepted even though the basic truths of our faith have gone unchanged since the time of Christ and proven themselves time and time throughout the history of Christianity.

If we want to know the truth all we have to do is to read the Bible and the Catechism of the Church. Yet those who proclaim these truths are constantly laughed at and not listened to. People say that the Church needs to get out of the dark ages and needs to be in step with the times. My people, if living a life according to the teachings and example of Jesus Christ is not being in step with the times or with the world, then let these times and the world pass on by and live your life in Jesus Christ. The teachings of Christ are unchanging just as God is unchanging, they do not change with the times, they are eternal. Our devotional practices may change but the truths which lead us to salvation are unchanging. Let us listen carefully to the teachings of the Pope and the magisterium, the official teaching office of the Church. God has given them to us to be our guide just as He gave the prophets to the Old Testament peoples. We must heed their message, their prophecy, or we will have to suffer the consequences for all eternity. Disobedience leads to the fall of mankind, obedience leads to eternal life with God. Which will you choose?

Myšlenky: Připomeňme si nejdříve evangelium minulé neděle. Tam se mluvilo o víře - o víře nemocné ženy a o víře otce, jehož dcera umírala. V obou případech Ježíš na tuto víru odpověděl činem, nemocní byli uzdraveni, těm, kteří v něho doufali, bylo pomoci. Dnešní evangelium ukazuje opak, totiž nevíru. Nazaretští se nejdřív podívají Ježíšově moudrosti, ale vzápětí si uvědomí, že Ježíš pro ně není neznámou postavou. Je jedním z nich, znají jeho příbuzné a tak nejenže od něj nečekají nic mimořádného, ale dělá jim možná i potíže připustit, že ten, který je jedním z nich, by je mohl v něčem převyšovat. Je to lidsky obyčejné a pochopitelné. Ale zároveň je hned vidět důsledek - Ježíš nemohl mezi nimi celkem nic vykonat. Chyběla víra - nechyběla Ježíšova moc! Ježíš nám nabízí vyvedení z kruhu vlastních přání a vlastních hříchů do okruhu Boží lásky, Božího království, prostě nabízí nám záchranu. Jeho nabídka je trvalá a mocná.
