O Mother of God, send forth the Holy Angels to defend us and drive far from us the cruel foe.

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! May God's love be with each of you. The month of August has begun. School and Religious Education classes will begin soon. Let us be praying for our students and their teachers as they make preparations for this new school year. Thank you to everyone who helped out with Vacation Bible School this past week. It was really wonderful and all the children enjoyed it and they learned something as well.

This weekend we welcome two visitors from the Czech Republic, Fr. Lukáš Janoušek and Deacon Daniel Vychodil. They are here for the Czech Summer Program in which transitional deacons are invited to Texas to improve their English, to get an experience of the Catholic Church in the United States, to visit Czech/Moravian settlements in Texas and to learn their history, and to get a better view of the USA. This year only one deacon was available to come so a newly ordained priest was invited also. I will be taking them to many places and events during the next two and a half weeks so please be patient with my absence.

This Monday and Tuesday priests of the Czech American Priests Association will be meeting here in the PAC building. We welcome them and hope they enjoy their two-day meeting. Bishop Patrick Zurek of Amarillo is the president of this organization. We welcome him back to the Diocese of Austin for this gathering.

On Tuesday, August 6, we will celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This feast recalls Moses and Elijah appearing on the mountain with Jesus, Peter, James and John. During this event Jesus' clothes became dazzling white as He is transfigured in their sight. It was a hint of how He would be after His resurrection. Since this is a feast day, I encourage you to try to attend Mass Tuesday morning at 7:00 am. Let us celebrate this feast and accept all that God wishes to bestow upon us.

Our readings today continue the same theme that was begun last weekend. In today's First Reading the people complain to Moses and God hears their complaining and sends them bread from heaven. Well, that was not enough to satisfy them so God sends them an abundance of quail in the evening. They had bread and meat to eat, but, as we well know, that was not enough to satisfy them either. They thought food would satisfy their bodily needs. But, they needed more. Sure, they had food to eat, but their spirit was dying. They so easily turned away from God and forgot what He had done for them.

Last week we began reading from the Gospel of John. We are focusing on the sixth chapter of this Gospel. I would encourage you to read the sixth chapter in its entirety. You will see a progression in the depth of faith that Jesus is asking of His apostles...going from that which can be seen and witnessed, that of the corporal world, to that of which cannot be seen but of which they are expected to believe. He is asking them to believe in the miracles that are taking place through Him, especially in the miracle of the Eucharist as He asks them to believe that His Body and Blood become present in the bread and wine which we receive at Mass. He will speak of this miracle as His Flesh and Blood that is for them to eat and to drink.

In the Gospel, John 6:24-35, Jesus speaks about the bread of God that gives life to the world and Jesus says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Jesus tells the apostles that the people were coming to Him because he fed them with earthly food. He wants His apostles to realize that it is not the earthly food which gives life, but it is He Himself that gives true life, that is satisfying to one's hunger pains. Next week this Gospel will continue and Jesus will say "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Jesus will emphasize the need to "eat His flesh and drink His blood", referring to the Eucharist. Jesus is calling them to a deeper faith, a faith in His Real Presence in the Eucharist. To believe that Jesus is really present in the Holy Communion we receive takes a deep faith, a real faith in Him. Let us give thanks to Him that we have received that faith and let us receive Him and be nourished by Him.
