In October, we will have our annual **Pastoral Council Member nominations process.** Please complete and return by Sunday, October 6.





Holy Trinity Catholic Church hosts in Partnership with Elite Medical Imaging, their annual Preventive Ultrasound Health Screening on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 26</u>, <u>2024</u>. Screenings will be performed in the CCE Room by appointment only. Ultrasound screenings are painless, non-invasive and contain no radiation. Eight preventive screenings will be offered: <u>carotid artery</u>, <u>abdominal aorta</u>, <u>thyroid</u>, <u>liver</u>, <u>spleen</u>, <u>gallbladder and both kidneys</u>. These screenings are not typically done at physician's visits or at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them, unless you are symptomatic. Screenings will be offered to you for \$60 each or the full preventive package (all 8 areas) for just \$170.00! \*Optional image file \$30.00 per patient. Payment is collected on the day of service, and we accept checks, cash, all major credit/debit cards, and flex and health savings cards. Our radiologist team

recommends these screenings be considered on an annual basis as a preventive measure. Oftentimes results can change from one year to the next based on age, stress factors and lifestyle. A representative from EMI will be here and at Holy Trinity Catholic Church the weekend of October 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> to offer registration and answer any questions you may have. However, if you prefer scheduling your appointment beforehand, please call 713-568-8331 or email Ultrasound-Screening@emi.us.com to request an appointment.

Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$25, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$25 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

#### Dear friends in Christ.

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! Autumn has begun so this gives us hope for cooler temperatures. With Autumn comes a change in our lives as well. Many people begin to think about All Hallows Eve, or Halloween, and the upcoming Thanksgiving Day, and even the Seasons of Advent and Christmas. There is not only a different feeling in the air but there is also a different feeling in our lives on a physical and spiritual level. God is calling us to reflect upon our life, our mortality, and the meaning of All Saints and All Souls Day, upon the angels as we soon celebrate the feast of the Guardian Angels on October 2. Also, God is calling us to reflect upon our attitude and spirit of thanksgiving that we are to have as His children. October 4 is the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. His feast day gives us all an opportunity to reflect upon our lives and how we serve God and one another with a sense of humility and how we live our lives with a sense of simplicity. We are also called to reflect upon our attitude towards life in general and our seeing all life, born and unborn, as being sacred and made in the image and likeness of God, as we celebrate Respect Life Sunday on October 6. This season of Autumn gives us much to think and to pray about.

Please be sure to turn in your nominations for the Pastoral Council by October 6. All nominations must be EIM certified, meaning, that they must have attended an Ethics and Integrity in Ministry workshop within the last three years.

This Sunday's Gospel also gives us much to think about, especially the seriousness of sin. Some people think that just because they say they believe in Jesus that they are going straight to heaven, no matter what sins they commit. Jesus makes it very clear that we will be held accountable for our sins and we will have to suffer the consequences of those sins. St. James in the second reading mentions how the rich, because of their sins, will be devoured by fire. Their gold and silver has become corroded and it will be a testimony against them. They have sought wealth and recognition while allowing the righteous to be murdered. Many of those "fat cats" in Washington, Wall Street and our State Legislatures are doing what is described in this reading while allowing babies to be killed in the wombs of their mothers, allowing the neglect of the elderly and the poor, allowing total disrespect for life so that they can become richer, lining their pockets with gifts from lobbyists and big corporations or unions. The day will come when they will be held accountable for the actions, for their greed and selfishness, and for their lack of action in defending life in all its stages. Let us pray that we will not be counted among them, but that we will seek God's mercy and forgiveness and undergo a change of heart and attitude. May the Holy Spirit enlighten us all to God's will and to God's way through our life in Jesus Christ.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

October is Respect Life and World Missions Month. During these next several weeks, your participation in acts of generosity is not just a blessing but a significant contribution to the Body of Christ. This is a distinctive time of the year when the Church promotes the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death and cultivates awareness and support for the mission territories of the Catholic Church. Your participation makes a difference.

The 2024-2025 Respect Life Program begins on October 1. The program complements and continues the work of the National Eucharistic Revival, highlighting Jesus' message in John 10:10: "I came so that they might have life." Part of the impetus for the Eucharistic Revival was a concern that some Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. Similarly, many people do not realize or acknowledge the sanctity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that may not be perceivable through our human senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not essential.

World Mission Sunday is October 20, and the theme chosen by Pope Francis is "Go and invite everyone to the banquet." This message, rooted in the parable of the wedding banquet, calls us to a renewed sense of mission, inviting all to partake in the Lord's feast of love and salvation. The second collection on World Mission Sunday is not merely a canonically mandatory tradition but a vital lifeline. It supports over 1,150 mission territories in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Pacific Islands, and the Middle East. Every donation is a testament to our collective commitment to the Great Commission (cf. Mt 28:19-20), a commitment of which you are an integral part. These funds are entirely devoted to evangelization efforts, including the support of seminaries, future religious sisters, catechists, Catholic schools, and healthcare centers that offer life-changing education and care to those most in need.

I invite you to be generous in supporting this annual collection. As we approach our work of evangelization, we are reminded that the Church of God is universal, not alien to any people. Evangelization is the Church's deepest identity, a particular grace and vocation proper to the People of God, as the Church exists to evangelize. Your prayers are a vital part of our shared mission, and I deeply value your spiritual support. We can continue to build heaven on earth by our love for Jesus and humanity, authenticated through your prayers and actions.
