Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! The glory of the Son has been revealed to us in many ways during these past few weeks. Let us share in His glory by sharing in His life.

Mark your Calendars for our annual Czech Mass in honor of Sts. Cyril and Methodius. The Mass will be on Sunday, February 16, at 5:00 p.m., followed by a meal in the PAC.

This weekend the Season of Christmas comes to an end as we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Our Christmas lights and decorations will be taken down and stored away for another year. Tomorrow the Season of Ordinary Time begins and will continue until the beginning of Lent on March 5. During Ordinary Time we reflect on the daily life and ministry of Jesus Christ. As we all know, His life and ministry was not so ordinary. Therefore, our life and ministry should not be so ordinary either. Jesus calls us, by virtue of our baptism, to live a radical life of faithfulness to Him and to His Church.

This feast of the Baptism of the Lord points to a new beginning in the life of Jesus. The baptism of Jesus cannot be viewed through our Christian understanding of baptism. We understand baptism to be a washing away of original sin. For each of us it is a putting on the life of Christ. It is dying to sin and rising to new life in Jesus Christ. It is becoming a member of the Body of Christ by uniting oneself to the Christian community. It is becoming a child of God in and through Jesus Christ. Our understanding of baptism has a direct relation to Christ himself. For us, our baptism says we are united with Christ.

The Baptism of Jesus is much different. It is the beginning of His public ministry, the beginning of the work which He was called to do by the Father. And as we all know, a new beginning can be a tough time in our life. I am sure that many of us have lost sleep, or spent many hours praying, or were filled with fear, or even shed tears over some new beginnings. This was probably also a difficult time for our Lord. He knew what He had to do. He knew that He would be rejected. He knew that eventually it would cost Him His life. Yet, this simple act of being immersed in water so beautifully tells us that His dying would bring about new life and that the Son of God was among the people: "You are my beloved Son. With you I am well pleased."

Since we are members of Christ's body, the Baptism of the Lord must take on a significant meaning in our own lives. The Baptism of the Lord calls us to do just as Jesus did: to accept our vocation in life and to become a public presence of God in the world. We cannot simply be private Christians, say our prayers in private, have a private set of beliefs of what is right and wrong, or a private value of God. No, we must be willing to be empowered by the Spirit to be a public sign, an active reality of Christ in the world. Too many Christians compromise their faith and morals in order to look good in the eyes of the world. If we do not begin to be whom we are called to be as baptized Catholic Christians, then we are failing not only God, but we are also failing ourselves and the whole Christian community. By doing this, we will fail to accomplish what God has called us to do through our baptism.

In today's first reading, Isaiah is telling us that we are to be a herald of good news. We are this herald when we allow our identity to become more like that of Jesus. Our life, by the way we live it, must be the life of Jesus for other people to see. We can only be that life of Jesus to others if we immerse our life into His life each day. Being Christ-like we are to be "heirs of hope in eternal life" as St. Paul tells us. May we be that hope to all the world, especially to those who are closest to us, our families and our friends. Let us be a sign of the hope of Jesus to one another. At the end of every Mass you are sent forth to be Jesus to everyone you meet. May we fulfill the mission to be Jesus to everyone and thus fulfill our baptismal calling.

Let us fulfill our baptism commitment by fulfilling the will of God in our lives by being faithful to Him, to His teachings and to His Church. May we all rejoice in the life in Christ we have received in Baptism. Let us go forth being Christ in the world.
