Ash Wednesday Masses (March 5) will be at 7:00 a.m., 12:00 noon and 6:30 p.m. There will be a special collection for the **World & Home Missions** at these Masses, to support the Catholic Church abroad. This envelope is in your contribution envelope box. Please be generous.

Fast and Abstinence During Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence and Fridays are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, His Resurrection.

First Friday of the month March 7: Friday's Mass is at 6:00 p.m. with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and Benediction. Due to the Lenten Fish Fry, **there will NOT be a KC First Friday Family potluck this month.** The gym will be open, though, for the kids. All parishioners are welcome.



Lenten Fish Fry – Beginning on Friday, March 7, we will be having a Fish Fry every Friday during Lent (not Good Friday). Plates will be available for Dine-In and Drive Thru at the PAC from 5:30 – 7:00 p.m., or until sold out. **Dine-In Plates: Adults \$15 / Child \$8. Drive-Thru: Adults Only plates.** Meal consists of American catfish, potato salad, cole slaw, pinto beans, hush puppies, pickles and tartar sauce.

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Thank you to all of you for your cards and prayers that you sent me for my birthday. It is truly a blessing to be here at Holy Trinity. I appreciate your kindness to me.

Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday, March 5, the Season of Lent will begin. During this week it would be good to prayerfully consider what you are going to do during Lent. Many people give up something, such as sweets, sodas, beer, or smoking. This is a good practice as you make a little sacrifice to remind you of the big sacrifice Jesus made for you on the cross. It is also good to do something extra, like attending the Stations of the Cross which we will have every Wednesday beginning on March 12. Also it is good to read more from the Bible or begin attending Mass during the weekdays when possible and, of course, being faithful to going to Mass every week on the weekend. You may also consider visiting the homebound more often or doing more acts of charity for others. These help you to grow in your spiritual life and in your relationship to God and to one another. Also, don't forget not to eat meat on Fridays during Lent and also on Ash Wednesday. Mass on Ash Wednesday will be at 7:00 am, 12 noon and 6:30 pm.

How many times have we given someone the wrong advice? Are you willing to admit that you gave someone the wrong advice? As Jesus says in today's Gospel, sometimes we are like the blind leading the blind. We send people down the wrong path in life. St. Paul tells us in the second reading, "Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." (1 Cor 15:58). If we do not fully devote ourselves to the work of the Lord as he says, then we are laboring in vain. All we do must be done for the Lord. If we approach everything with this attitude, then we will be doing our best to lead others where God wants them to go. We will then be as Jesus tells us in today's Gospel, we will be producing good fruit. As Jesus tells us, "A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." (Lk 6.45). We always want to produce that which is good. We have to remember that the good or evil we do has lasting effects for many, many years. Our words and actions can be good, wise and creative, as mentioned below, or they can be very destructive. What has been the result of your words and actions? What do you want the result to be? As we begin the Season of Lent this week, we want to do all we can to improve our lives so that they produce that which is good. We need to take time to weed out all that is bad. We need to get rid of any rotten fruit that we are holding on to. Take time this Lenten Season to purify your thoughts, words, and actions. By doing this you will become "firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

May all of you have a wonderful week and a very spiritually renewing Season of Lent.
