Dear friends in Christ.

Praised be the Risen Lord! Alleluia! Here we are already at the Third Sunday of Easter. As we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord we are reading gospel passages which contain the events of Jesus appearing to His disciples after the resurrection. In today's Gospel Jesus appears to the Apostles at the Sea of Tiberias. Peter and the others have gone fishing and once again have caught nothing. Jesus once again instructs them where to fish and they catch a net full of fish. They realize it is Jesus and guickly go to shore. Jesus tells them to bring some of the fish and then He prepares breakfast for them. After this Jesus looks at Peter and says, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Jesus asks this to Peter three times, the number of times Peter denied knowing Jesus after Jesus' arrest. Peter replies, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus tells Peter to feed His lambs, tend His sheep, and feed His sheep. Jesus is reaffirming Peter's position as leader of the Apostles and as the leader of this Church that the Apostles will form. Jesus also lets Peter know that he will have to suffer just as Jesus suffered. We are all called to express our love to Jesus by being willing to suffer for Him and His Church. In the midst of persecution we are asked to be strong, to have faith, and to trust in the Lord. We are called to proclaim the Truth and defend the Church against lies and false accusations. To do this we must be knowledgeable of our faith. This is one reason why our parish is providing all of you with the FORMED website. It has a wealth of resource materials, such as saints' videos, history of the Church videos, Sacrament videos, Bible Study and much more. We must study and learn and rely on the Holy Spirit to give us what we need so that we can speak as Jesus would have us to speak. We must know what the Truth is so that we can defend this Church that Jesus established. We must be able to root out lies that are continually present in the media, whether it be on TV, radio, newspapers or the internet. We must speak the Truth! Pope Francis, may he rest in peace, always emphasized how we must learn to help those in need by educating them and helping them with their needs, especially in being merciful, compassionate and understanding to them in their situation in life. In doing so we give faithful witness to Jesus Christ. Please take advantage of this great resource and grow in knowledge of your faith while growing closer to God and His Church. As we hear in today's second reading from the Book of Revelation, "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." "Amen."

Warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

Don't forget that Mother's Day is next Sunday. Love them while you still have them with you in this world.
