Dear friends in Christ.

Praised be Jesus Christ! Thank you to everyone who helped out with the June Fundraiser last Sunday. The meal was outstanding as usual and everyone enjoyed the music and dancing. It was a wonderful day of food and fellowship.

Next Sunday, June 15, we will have a brief altar server practice for those who will be serving at the 7:30 am Mass on Sunday, June 22, for the Corpus Christi Procession. All 5 altar servers are asked to be at this practice.

We are in need of a Pro-life Coordinator for our parish. This ministry is not time-consuming but yet very important. If you believe you may be called to this ministry please contact me so that we can discuss its responsibilities and duties. This is a volunteer position.

May the Spirit of God be with you all. Today we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and the others who were gathered in the upper room where they were staying. After the Holy Spirit descended upon them, as tongues of flame on their heads, the Apostles, being led by Peter, went forth with courage and proclaimed Jesus to all that they met. The Holy Spirit gives each of us those same gifts that were given to the Apostles. We are to go forth and proclaim the name of Jesus just as they did. How well are we doing this? Do we call out to the Spirit to be with us? It is important that we seek to live in the Holy Spirit each day.

Pentecost is also considered the birthday of the Church. Jesus had already consecrated the Apostles to be His priests, as we read in the Gospel of John, and now He gives them all they need to begin to form His Church, which by the end of the 1st Century would already be called the Catholic Church. Jesus said that He would be with Church and that the "powers of death would not prevail against it." We are that Church and we believe that what Jesus said is true and that He is with us. Victory is His!

Monday begins the Season of Ordinary Time, a time in which we reflect upon the ordinary day-to-day life of Jesus as He ministers to God's people. However, each day of His life, in comparison to ours, was not so ordinary...it was rather extraordinary! We too are called to live this same life of Jesus and to be God's presence to one another. May we fulfill this calling by loving one another as God loves us. May the Holy Spirit be with us in this great adventure.

On Wednesday, June 11, we celebrate the feast of **St. Barnabas**. He was an important companion of St. Paul in the early Church helping him to establish Christian communities all throughout Asia Minor and Greece. He and St. Paul went to Jerusalem to consult the Apostles about what should be required of the Gentile converts. This meeting became known as the Council of Jerusalem, the first Council of the Church. May we have the same apostolic spirit to proclaim the name of Jesus in our own day and time.

I would like to thank parents for bringing their babies and little children to Mass. We are glad they are here. If they begin to make noise, cry or scream we ask that you take them either to the cry room, foyer of the church or the hall leading to the restrooms. There is a speaker in each of these areas so you can still listen and participate in the Mass. Or, if you wish, may also take them outside. When your baby or small child is crying or screaming it makes it difficult for others to hear what is being said and it makes it difficult for the choir or cantors to sing. Please be sensitive to others in the church who are trying to listen to what is being said at Mass.

Warmer weather, or, hotter weather, is here. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

Please pray for the following men who will be ordained priests next Saturday: Scott Fyall, Kingsley Ohaeri, Michael Noriega, Michael Rhodes and Ladd Spears. May God's Spriit be upon them and may His love dwell within them.
