Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Don't forget that this is Respect Life month. Continue to pray for those who are praying in front of abortion clinics, for those who are going there for abortions, and for those who are working for Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities killing babies in the wombs of their mothers. May they have a conversion of heart and mind and may God's mercy be with them. May they see the evil that they are doing.

We will have our Parish Mission, October 19 thru 23. Please mark your calendars and set aside all other activities during this week and come to this mission. This is a good opportunity for you and your family to grow spiritually and to better understand the Catholic Faith. Strengthen your relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ by attending this Mission.

Today's Gospel is about the king who invited many guests to a wedding feast for his son. Those who were invited refused to come. Some of those invited killed the king's servants. The king became furious and sent his troops to destroy them. Then he sent more of his servants to go and invite whomever they could find. Many came but the king noticed that some were not wearing their wedding garment. These people that were not properly dressed were thrown out into the streets and were not allowed to remain at the feast. What does this mean? Donald Schwager writes: *Jesus' parable contains two stories. The first has to do with the original guests invited to the marriage feast. The king had sent out invitations well in advance to his subjects, so they would have plenty of time to prepare for coming to the feast. How insulting for the invited guests to then refuse when the time for celebrating came! They made light of the King's request because they put their own interests above his. They not only insulted the King but the heir to the throne as well. The king's anger is justified because they openly refused to give the king the honor he was due. Jesus directed this warning to the Jews of his day, both to convey how much God wanted them to share in the joy of his kingdom, but also to give a warning about the consequences of refusing his Son, their Messiah and Savior.*

The second part of the story focuses on those who had no claim on the king and who would never have considered getting such an invitation. The "good and the bad" along the highways certainly referred to the Gentiles and to sinners. This is certainly an invitation of grace – undeserved, unmerited favor and kindness! But this invitation also contains a warning for those who refuse it or who approach the wedding feast unworthily. Grace is a free gift, but it is also an awesome responsibility. Only if we are willing to fulfill our responsibilities as a Christian will we be allowed to remain at the feast. This means being faithful to the teachings of Jesus and to His Church. May all of us be able to remain at the banquet of the Lord and together share in the joys of His Kingdom.
