Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! The summer is quickly passing by, some people are taking their vacations before school begins, others are working around the clock to bring in the harvest, and everyone is preparing for the start of another school year. In all this busyness, we remain focused on God's love for us and on that which is most important, doing all for the greater glory and honor of God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns the people against being greedy. The rich man stored up everything so that he could sit back, relax and enjoy life. However, his life came to a quick end and he did not get to enjoy all he had saved. Jesus warns us against this kind of thinking. Apparently the man only thought of himself, he did not think about those who were in need and who could have used the grain for food. This man lacked compassion and concern for other people. In today's first reading it says, "Vanity of vanities, say Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" Qoheleth is telling us that the things of this world are useless in comparison with the things of God. We work and toil for things and then they are quickly gone or we leave them at our death to other people who waste them or throw them away. Qoheleth says to enjoy them now. Do not store them up for the future, because the future dreams you have may never come. Use them for the benefit of yourself and for the benefit of others. Only then do these things have value. I often see so many people who save money and things all their life and then they die before they can enjoy what they have saved. Or, they save it for their children or grandchildren to have, who then fight over what is left or waste it away on useless things. Do good with what you have. Be thankful for it, and, if there is something left over when you die, make plans that it will be used in a way that is not wasteful. There are many charitable organizations, including your parish, who could use it for the good of many people. Use wisely what God has given you. Enjoy it while you are still able to do so, but, keep others in mind as well.
