Dear friends in Christ,

May the grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Next Saturday, we will celebrate the Fourth of July, Independence Day. Many of the freedoms and liberties that hundreds of thousands of people died for since the foundation of our great country have slowly been chipped away over the last 50 years or so. Our Church is asking us to pray that these freedoms and liberties be protected so that we, our children, our grandchildren and generations to come, can enjoy the freedoms and liberties that men and women have died for so that we can have a better life. As we celebrate this Fourth of July, please pray especially for Respect for all Life, from the first moment of conception to natural death, for defense of marriage as God intends it to be, and, for Religious Freedom, that we may be able to live and profess our faith without worry of being fined or jailed. These are God-given rights and freedoms. We pray that our President and legislatures will always have the courage to defend these rights and freedoms.

In today's Gospel, we have two healing stories in one. While Jesus is on His way to heal the daughter of Jairus, a woman touches His clothes and is immediately healed. However, Jairus' daughter, in the meantime, dies. Speaking to the woman who touched Him, Jesus says, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." Jesus knew that woman really believed in Him. Then, as they are still talking, people come to tell Jesus that Jairus' daughter has died. Jesus tells them "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He goes to Jairus' house along with Peter, James and John, and brings her back to life.

We need to remind ourselves of Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." In every difficult situation in life, Jesus wants us to know that He is with us and that with His help we will get through it. It takes faith and a desire to want to do what Jesus wants for us in our life. Always be comforted by the fact that Jesus is with you, that He loves you, He gives you all you need. Just try to be faithful to Him and trust in Him.
