

Dear friends in Christ,

"Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come." This is our Gospel Acclamation today as we celebrate this Trinity Sunday. One God, Three Divine Persons. A mystery of our faith. This mystery was revealed to us by Jesus Christ as He said "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit..." as found in the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus also spoke of Himself as the Son and how He and the Father are one. He also spoke of sending us the Holy Spirit, which we celebrated last Sunday on the feast of Pentecost. Our belief in the Trinity is central to our faith as Christians. It is one of the teachings that all Christians profess, even if they never mention the term in their services, and it is one of the teachings that must be professed by every denomination if they are going to call themselves Christian. We profess our belief in the Trinity every time we make the Sign of the Cross and any time a blessing is given by a priest or deacon. In some cultures, parents will bless their children each day by making the Sign of the Cross on their foreheads before their children leave the house to go to school or work or wherever they may be going. I would recommend that you begin this tradition in your own homes. Let your children know that you want God to bless them and protect them. Also, we usually end our prayer by saying "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen." May the most holy Trinity bless us all.

Next Sunday, May 29, is Corpus Christi Sunday. We will have our annual Corpus Christi Procession after Mass on Sunday morning.

Congratulations to all of our High School Graduates who will be graduating this week. May they turn to God for guidance as they go forth into the world. The Jarrell HS Baccalaureate service will be held here on Wednesday, May 24, at 7:00 p.m.

Congratulations to Fr. David Konderla of our Diocese who has been appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Tulsa, Oklahoma. Bishop-Elect Konderla will be ordained on June 29 in Tulsa. In the last 2 years, three priests of the Diocese of Austin have been appointed as bishops. This is really an honor to our Diocese. May the Holy Spirit be with Bishop-Elect Konderla as he prepares to begin his ministry as the Shepherd of the Diocese of Tulsa. He and I were ordained priests together in 1995. I know he will be a very holy and faithful bishop.

As I mentioned last week, warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

How to report an incident of concern - The Diocese of Austin is committed to preventing harm from happening to any of our children or vulnerable adults. If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 orwww.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on REPORT ABUSE OR AN EIM CONCERN). Reports may be made anonymously.
