The Secret of Salt ... Though I am not known for my cooking skills, the other day I thought I'd try my hand at it.

After gathering the ingredients, I set to work. First, I took a slice of bread. Then I took the main ingredient, a new container of salt, and poured the entire contents onto the slice of bread. Then I added the other piece of bread. Then it was ready to eat.

You might be thinking that I am crazy. You'd be right. Of course, no one eats a salt sandwich. No. We use a little bit of salt to bring out the flavor in that which we are eating. Notice that the salt typically disappears in the process. It was never all about the salt anyway. Salt is used to bring out the best in food, but the salt itself disappears.

Jesus says, of you and me, "You are the salt of the earth." It is our job to bring out the best in others. It is never meant to be all about us anyway. When we serve rightly, like salt, people don't really notice us so much. We disappear a bit.

This day, can you love a little more like that? Can you work to bring out the best in others, but do so more in the background? Can you be "salt of the earth"?

Catholic Social Teaching Corner - June 18-19, 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - To proclaim Jesus as Messiah is to recognize Him as God's anointed; the one who saves us from sin and death, from despair and loneliness. It also means entering into the paradox of the cross with him: salvation from sin and death is through death; salvation from loneliness and despair is through submission, denial and loss. To be one with Christ means being willing to accept the cross – dying to self for others, even for our enemies. Are we willing to do this?

EIM Workshops and compliance - Persons needing to attend an EIM workshop should go to <https://www.eappsdb.com> in order to find the workshop schedule and Sign Up for a Workshop. If you don't recall your User ID/Password, please use the Alternate Login option to access your application. If you have never submitted an EIM application (online or paper copy), use the above link to create your EIM account and complete the application. Attendance at either a Basic or Refresher workshop meets the 3-year refresher compliance requirement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact Emily Hurlimann at (512) 949-2447 to discuss an alternative workshop arrangement.

How to report an incident of concern - The Diocese of Austin is committed to preventing harm from happening to any of our children or vulnerable adults. If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 or www.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on REPORT ABUSE OR AN EIM CONCERN). Reports may be made anonymously.

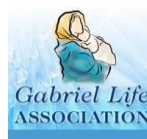
