Changes concerning the use of our Parish Activity Center (PAC): the PAC Manager is now in charge of rentals only --- will be there at the beginning of the function to make sure all is taken care of --- will NOT stay for the duration – but will come back before the function ends to make sure the building is as it should be and then lock up. Contact information will be left with the Renter for any problems/questions. **The PAC Manager is no longer in charge of the PAC when it comes to our 'parish social activities' (i.e. Fundraisers, Hospitality Sunday, Senior Citizen's Suppers, CCE/CYM activities, etc.).** The 'coordinators' of our parish events will now be responsible for obtaining the PAC keys from the parish office prior to the event and then following the PAC Guidelines (which are posted on bright green paper in the PAC kitchen) to make sure all is handled correctly. **The overall cleaning of the building**, will be done by the PAC Manager after ALL functions, including rentals and parish social activities (though, as always, the PAC must be left as it was found, by both Renters and our activity coordinators, with the exception of mopping and cleaning the restrooms.) A copy of the PAC Guidelines mentioned above can be acquired at the parish office as well. These Guidelines are only for our parish social activities, not rentals. Naaman was also a foreigner who was healed. Both of these stories point out the fact that God loves all people, not just a select few. Sometimes it is those who do not know Him who are more thankful than those who do claim to know Him. Sometimes they seem to have more faith than religious leaders do. How about us? Are we like the nine lepers who never returned to give thanks to Jesus? Or, are we like Naaman and the Samaritan who rejoiced over their being healed and who gave thanks to God? Are we grateful to our parents, teachers, priests, nuns, and others who try to help us walk with God? Ingratitude leads to bitterness, hatred, anger, revenge, negativity, and much more. Let us pray that we have a heart filled with gratitude and an awareness of what God does for us each day. His mercy and love endures forever. "Sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands: break into song; sing praise." Ps 34:4.
