Dear friends in Christ.

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! Don't forget to mark you calendars to attend Mass on Friday, November 1, as we celebrate All Saints Day, a Holy Day of Obligation. November 2 is All Souls Day. Let us also attend Mass and pray for all the faithful departed as they go through the purification process that we call Purgatory. May they soon enter into the fullness of God's presence. During the entire month of November we are encouraged to pray for the souls in Purgatory. Pray for these souls. Maybe one day you will be wanting someone to pray for you also. Teach your children to continue this tradition. It is the least we can do for our deceased friends and relatives and for those who have no one to pray for them.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells the parable about the Pharisee and the tax collector who went to the temple to pray. The Pharisee, even though he said a prayer of thanksgiving, was only bragging to God that he was better than everyone else. The tax collector stayed further back and recognized his own sinfulness and asked God for mercy. The Gospel is a lesson of humility, a humility that is justifying and life-giving. When we come to church to pray are we more like the Pharisee or the tax collector? In today's day and time many people are like the Pharisee, they are not able to admit that they are a sinner and they are too proud to go to Him seeking His mercy and forgiveness. This is really sad because if we are not able to admit to our sinfulness and ask for mercy now then we will not be able to do it at the time of our death and we will sentence ourselves to eternal damnation. Having a fear of hell is a good thing as long as we do not become preoccupied with it. Having a sense of sin is a good thing also, as long as we do not become preoccupied with it. Even though we are sinners we are still children of God, we are still a holy people and sacred beings. May we never forget the awesomeness of God's love for us and may we always have the humility to go and seek His love and His mercy.
