

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord be with each of you. I hope that all of you had a very joyful and blessed Thanksgiving Day. Remember to keep the spirit of thanksgiving in your heart all throughout the year. Always recognize how you are blessed and give thanks to God every day for those blessings.

Thank you to Providence Funeral Home in Taylor for donating some of their 2017 Calendars to our parish. May they be a source of inspiration to all who took one home.

Today we begin the holy Season of Advent. Most of you have already made your plans for family gatherings and events during this season and during the upcoming Christmas Season. During the next four weeks, we will be preparing ourselves for the celebration of the Birth of the Lord at Christmas. The Christmas Season begins on the evening of December 24 and continues until Monday, January 9, when we will celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. So, after Christmas Day on December 25, please do not say that Christmas is over because it has actually just begun. Too many Catholics and other Christians have given into the secular celebration of Christmas, a celebration that is completely absent of the presence of Jesus Christ, whose birthday we celebrate. Don't fall into this trap. Celebrate these special seasons as they are meant to be celebrated. Celebrate Advent as a time of preparation, make a good confession and spend extra time in prayer with your family.

During the Season of Advent, we usually begin decorating our homes for Christmas. I always recommend that you wait until the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, before you turn on your Christmas lights. Also, I encourage you to leave your tree and decorations up and your Christmas lights shining until the end of the Christmas Season on January 9. Let us truly celebrate Christmas during the entire Christmas Season. I also encourage parish organizations to have their Christmas parties during the Christmas Season and not during Advent. In the USA, Santa Claus has only become an advertising gimmick. Instead of Santa coming to our parties, we should live the truth of our faith and have St. Nicholas, Bishop of Myra, come to our celebrations. He is the one who brought gifts to the poor and needy of his day. Our faith is filled with wonderful traditions that have been handed down to us during the past 2000 years. The more we present our faith in the spirit and truth it is meant to teach, the more people will have a conversion of heart and think about the faith they have received.

Today's readings speak to us about the fulfillment of God's promise to His people. This is in reference to the coming of the Messiah. This promise has been fulfilled in Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who was born of the virgin, Mary. We await the final establishment of the Kingdom as we prepare ourselves for the Second Coming of Jesus on the great day of the final Resurrection. Our Gospel reading today, taken from the Gospel of Luke, encourages us to be vigilant and to wait with great expectation, preparing ourselves through prayer, so that we are strong in our faith...so that we can persevere in living our life in Jesus until He returns in glory. In Advent, we prepare not only for the birth of Jesus, but also for His ultimate return when all will be made new.

This week, we will begin having Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday from 3:00 pm until 9:00 pm. Please come and spend some time with the Lord in prayer. Experience His love and love Him in return.

May all of you have a very blessed Advent and Christmas Season.
