Tomorrow's forecast: God reigns and the Son shines!

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! It has truly been a hot week. Usually during summer we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son, Jesus, in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. After all, isn't God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the love of your life as I mentioned last weekend in my homily? We need to show God how much we truly love Him. We do this by the way we dress for Mass and by how punctual we are for Mass as well. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Ask yourself if you stand in honor in His presence? Is God proud of you by how you come before Him? Does the way you dress for Mass give praise to God?

The time has come for us to once again pray for rain. However, we need to pray that our farmers will have favorable weather for their crops and for when they will soon be harvesting corn and grain sorghum.

At the beginning of our Gospel today Jesus says, "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth...". Also our Psalm Response says, "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God." Do we praise God with our entire being? How well do you praise Him? Please take a moment to reflect on the popular hymn "Praise to the Lord." There are many versions of this hymn as different people translate it differently from German. It was written my Joachim Neander in the mid 1600's. Here is the version from Wordpress:

- 1. Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation!
 O my soul, praise him, for he is your health and salvation.
 All you who hear, now to his altar draw near, join in profound adoration.
- 2. Praise to the Lord, let us offer our gifts at his altar; let not our sins and transgressions now cause us to falter. Christ, the High Priest, bids us all to join his feast, gathered with him at the altar.
- 3. Praise to the Lord, who will prosper our work and defend us; surely his goodness and mercy here daily attend us; ponder anew all the Almighty can do, he who with love will befriend us.
- 4. Praise to the Lord, oh, let all that is in us adore him!All that has life and breath, come now in praises before him.Let the Amen sound from his people again, now as we worship before him.

Allow God to love you and speak to your heart and then praise Him in song.

Catholic Social Corner: July 8/9 - 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time: In the heat of the summer it is good to hear these words of Jesus: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest."
