RCIA Classes to Begin September 12, 2017 - RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults -- a process for welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is a community journey that leads to a transformation of mind and spirit. The RCIA is mainly for non-Catholics who want to become Catholic, but adult Catholics who have not received all of the Sacraments (Communion, Confession, Confirmation) may also come into full communion with the Church through the RCIA process. Also, anyone who is already Catholic and would like to learn more about their faith are welcome to attend the classes which will be held every Tuesday evening at 7:00 pm. in the RE Bldg, beginning on Tuesday, September 12. If you would like to become Catholic, or are Catholic and need to receive First Communion, Confession, and/or Confirmation, you will need to schedule an appointment with Fr. #### Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord be with you all. In today's gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of the Sower, or of the Seed, or of the Soil, depending on what point one wants to emphasize. If we look at it as the parable of the Sower, it is obvious that the Sower is meant to be God. God is the One who does the sowing. God creates gifts, such as our faith, and spreads them across the world. God does this because of the love which He has for all of us, not because He has to. As any farmer, God has high expectations for the seed He plants and how it will turn out. Thus, God sows very generously.

If we look at this parable as that of the Seed, we see that the seed must have been terribly important to the Father, the Sower, or else Jesus would not have been concerned about it. The seed is given the opportunity to sprout and to grow and to produce much fruit. It can even produce a hundredfold. I think we could all say that this is a pretty powerful seed. It is important to remember, however, that Jesus did say, "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies, it produces much fruit." We need to let God plant good, healthy seed within us. But the Soil must be adequately prepared if this seed is to produce good fruit. Seed cannot produce much of anything if it is planted in poor soil.

So this leads us to the third part of this parable, which is that of the Soil. The Soil, of course, refers to you and me. The people to whom Matthew was writing his gospel knew that Jesus was referring to them as the "soil" on which God put the seed. But what kind of soil are we? Are we the barren footpath on which nothing can grow? Or, are we the rocky ground where there can be no roots and the plant eventually withers and dies? Or the thorn patch, with a lot of briers that choke off the seed that God plants? Or, are we the good soil, a soil that is rich and fertile - that any seed would love to be planted in?

Are we a soil that invites in the sun and the rain which help the seed to grow? In order for soil to be rich and fertile, it must contain the proper minerals, which it receives from the rest of nature. Do we allow God to give us the minerals, the graces, necessary to grow the seed which is given to us by God in order to produce much fruit ... or are we like rocks on which the minerals, the graces, just run off, not being of any use whatsoever? God has given us, and is giving us, the opportunity to be good soil. Are we going to grasp that opportunity, or turn away from it?

I like to be optimistic and believe that all of us come to Mass so that we will be good soil. We are nourished by the Word of God and by the Body and Blood of His Son, Jesus Christ. Unless the soil is fed, it cannot produce good fruit. If for some reason, any of you are not able to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus at this Mass, then I encourage you to do what is necessary to be able to receive Communion in the future. We need to be fed by God if we are to do the will of God in our lives. By God's grace, and our own efforts, we can change the type of soil we discover in our hearts. Through our participation in the Eucharist, Christ makes the soil of our hearts more fertile, able to produce abundant crops for the Kingdom of God. Let us allow Him to plant the seed of Christ within us so that we are able to go and bear much fruit.

This week, we will welcome three transitional deacons from the Czech Republic: Jan Jurečka, Vojtěch Zahrádka and Jiří Šůstek. They will arrive on Tuesday and will stay with us for about 4 weeks. Two weekends, they will be here for all the Masses. One weekend they will be in Houston and the other weekend in West. I will, once again, be taking them to various activities and events during their stay with us, so I will be out of the office much of the time.

**Pope Francis wants to hear from young adults!** Young people (ages 16-30s) and those who know young people are invited to fill out a short survey at <u>www.austindiocese.org/synod</u>. This survey will be available until Aug. 1, 2017. I encourage all young people of our parish to complete the survey. Your input is important to the Church.

The time has come for us to once again pray for rain. However, we need to pray that our farmers will have favorable weather for their crops and for when they will soon be harvesting corn and grain sorghum.

We are well set into the hot summertime of the year. Usually during summer, we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that, as we come to Mass, we come to worship God and to receive His Son, Jesus, in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. After all, isn't God... Father, Son, and Holy Spirit ... the love of your life, as I mentioned last weekend in my homily? We need to show God how much we truly love Him. We do this by the way we dress for Mass and also by how punctual we are for Mass. The general rule, that I believe is appropriate, is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless and no spaghetti straps. Ask yourself if you stand in honor in His presence? Is God proud of you by how you come before Him? Does the way you dress for Mass give praise to God?

May all of you have a very blessed week.
