Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with all of you! The summer vacation for our students is quickly winding down. Let us pray for all children and their parents as they prepare for the upcoming school year.

This week, the Czech Deacons and I will go to Caldwell and Frenstat for a gathering on Monday. Tuesday and Wednesday, we will be attending a meeting of the Czech American Priests Association here at our parish. Thursday, we go to Fayetteville for the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women's Rural Life Mass; and on Friday, the Deacons will go to San Antonio. Pray for safe travels for all.

Today's Gospel continues the theme concerning the Kingdom of Heaven. When we see how valuable the Kingdom of Heaven is, the pearl of all pearls, we will do whatever it takes in order to obtain it. One of the problems for most people, though, is that they never seem to see the brilliance of this pearl, nor the value of it. We have to hunt for it many times. But to do this, we have to hunt for the virtues in which it takes to obtain this great pearl. We have to be willing to do penance for the soul, to persevere in prayer, and be willing to embrace God's commandments.

In my short time as a priest, I have seen many people who have to work harder than most in order to see the brilliance and value of that great pearl, the "Kingdom of Heaven." However, this great pearl is always near us, but many times, it gets covered up or pushed aside so that we are unable to see it. And, many times, it seems that other people have obtained this great pearl and we have not. We have all heard that saying, "the grass is always greener on the other side of the fence." But we know that this is not true. We tend to want what belongs to others because it seems different than what we have. We can be envious of others' talents, wealth, car, house or lifestyle, but the kingdom of heaven, the object of our longing, is not going to be found in someone else's field ... by wishing we were someone else. We have to look to our own fields, our own lives, our present relationships ... for it is in these that God speaks to us, reveals Himself, loves us, offers us hope, growth and love. It is in our own lives that we will find the hidden treasure, the pearl of great price. The kingdom of heaven is within us -- but we have to be able to recognize that treasure. To look elsewhere is to end up chasing the wind.

Discovering the kingdom, allowing the kingdom to take possession of us, is not a once-and-for-all thing. It is a process. God takes us exactly as we are: the good bits and the bad bits, our vices as well as our virtues. God catches into His net all that makes us who we are and sorts through it, throwing out that which is destructive or negative. In doing this, we are made whole. This way to wholeness is often painful, because there is pain involved in growth and re-birth. But this is the only way to satisfy our longing for wholeness - there is no alternative. We must look to our own lives, to our own circumstances, to find God's kingdom and God's love for us. The pearl exists within us. All we need to do is to find it and polish it up a little. Then it can shine for the world to see. Maybe by seeing it within us, others will come to find it in themselves as well.

Please continue to pray for rain and for favorable weather for our farmers who are harvesting their crops, and may you all have a most blessed week.
