Dear friends in Christ.

**He is Risen!** He is Truly Risen! Today is the Octave Day of the Easter Season. We continue to focus on and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. May we all be open to receiving the love and mercy of God. We will have a Divine Mercy Service at 3:00 pm today. Everyone is invited to attend. Incense will be used during the Service.

The gospel of today is very appropriate for the Feast of Divine Mercy as we see in the interaction between Jesus and the apostle Thomas. If we look at the three times Thomas speaks in Scripture, we see that he is a man of great courage, but also, a practical, down-to-earth, no-nonsense kind of person who has great affection for Jesus. When Thomas first realized that they were not going to deter Jesus from going to Jerusalem and facing his death, he says to the disciples, "Let us go and die with him." That took great courage.

At the Last Supper when Jesus was preparing the disciples for his death, he told them that he was going to prepare a place for them and that he would come to take them to that place so they could be with him. Jesus also said that they knew the way to the place where he was going. Thomas, practical man that he was, said, "Lord, we do not know where you are going so how can we know the way?" Jesus' response is the revelation, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Jesus is our map to heaven.

Today's gospel tells us that when Jesus first appeared to the disciples, Thomas was not there. When Thomas did return, the disciples eagerly told him what he missed and Thomas flat-out said he would not believe unless he personally could touch the wounds of Jesus. When Jesus came again a week later, Thomas was present and Jesus invited him to fulfill the conditions for his belief. Thomas in awe and wonder replied with those wonderful words of faith, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus cared so deeply about Thomas that he spared no effort to bring him to faith, even letting him put his finger into the mark of the nails in his hand and his hand into the wound in his side.

God is willing to meet us where we are. There is no situation, no crisis of faith, no experience of brokenness that God is not willing to be there with us. Often we find it difficult to be where we are; to feel the emotions that are stirring; to face the questions that arise; to deal with the doubts and fears that threaten us. Thomas needed proof in order to believe in the resurrection and he openly said so. He did not pretend a faith he did not have or talk himself out of his doubt. This is not to say he loved Jesus any less.

Jesus has promised to be with us in our struggles. We do not have to face painful experiences alone. We do not have to depend on our own efforts. We do not have to pretend to have faith when we are lacking it. We can freely say to God, "This is awful. I don't like it." We can say whatever we want and know that God will listen to us and respond. Let us pray that we stay in dialogue with God so that our trust may grow and we may say with Thomas, "My Lord and my God."

This is what Jesus asks of us. He has proven his love for us in the person of Jesus Christ, whose blood and water flowed from his side as is illustrated on the picture of Divine Mercy by the red and white rays coming from his heart. Just as Jesus wanted to prove to Thomas His resurrection, Jesus wants to prove His mercy to us. He wants us to know that His mercy is unlimited. That is why He asked that we celebrate this feast of Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter. Jesus died for our sins and God wants us to know that we are forgiven through the sacrifice of the cross. Our Lord told Sister Faustina, "It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter... I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fountain of My mercy." All of us are poor sinners and are in need of God's mercy. Let us be like Thomas and say "My Lord and my God!" and accept the unlimited, overflowing mercy of God.

Warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

May all of you continue to experience the joy of the resurrected Lord in this Easter Season.
