Dear friends in Christ,

Here we are on this Fifth Sunday of Easter. The Easter Season is quickly passing by. Many college students are preparing for final exams. It can be a nerve-wrecking time. We must always remind ourselves that Jesus gave us new life in His resurrection. We need to live in that new life, which means living in Him. May His resurrected life give you peace and comfort knowing that He is with you.

The month of May begins on Tuesday and during this month we give honor to our Blessed Mother, Mary. Don't forget to pray the rosary daily reflecting upon the mysteries for each day. In doing so we grow closer to her Son, Jesus, and we grow stronger in our faith.

Each of today's readings is concerned with this sharing of love in friendship. Peter comes to understand that God did not preserve himself for a chosen few. Jew and Gentile alike were to receive His love freely given. In today's gospel John speaks of the love of God, a love by which sin is forgiven, and by which anything that might separate us from God is removed. Love is given and received through Jesus Christ, by God becoming man. By this we are lifted from the state of servant to become a friend of God. St. Paul says that "We can now say Abba, Father," as Christ said "Father," and in so doing we are caught up with Him into the mystery of the Trinity. In today's gospel we see clearly that Jesus is our friend and therefore we are friends of God the Father and friends of the Holy Spirit.

This friendship with God is reflected in our friendship with each other, often imperfectly, for we have levels and degrees of friendship. With some the mutuality and understanding is easier, because, we say we have more in common with them.

We cannot receive friendship unless we give it. Do we expect the other person to be always available, always to be there to meet our needs? And do we turn away from those who are not quite like us and with whom we might be ashamed to be seen? Like Peter, before he was shown otherwise, we are so often suspicious of the stranger, a little afraid of the "otherness" of people we do not know. If we do not understand someone, we are reluctant to offer any part of ourselves as friends.

All of us are aware of the fact that we cannot be true friend to everyone in the world. A little six year old once said, "You can only love things near you, you can't love countries or lots of people." But if by doing what we believe to be right, by living the truth in our lives as we see it, by loving God with all the strength that we can, and our neighbor as ourselves, if in this way we can love God in other people, whether they are special to us or not, then we are part of loving which embraces the world, and we and God are friends.

When we receive the Eucharist together, receiving Holy Communion, we are participating in the greatest act of worship we can do together as Catholics. Theologians have referred to the Eucharist as "the bread of angels," "bread from heaven"; it has been called the medicine of immortality for Jesus said, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me." It is a promise from Jesus that He will take us to heaven if we receive Him and follow Him. What a great and wonderful promise and gift our Lord has given us. Let us always show our appreciation to our Lord for this great gift by spending a few minutes in prayer giving thanks to Jesus for giving us His Body and Blood. We should never receive Holy Communion at Mass and then just walk straight out the door. This is like slapping Jesus in the face after you have received Him. Go back to the pew and say a prayer and stay at Mass until the prayer after Mass is completed. After all, you would not go to someone's home and eat dinner with them and then after you take the last bite get up and run out the door. No, you would stay a little while longer visiting with them before you leave and thanking them for the wonderful meal. Even more so we should stay with the Lord until all is completed and then go home and live what we have received.

Warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.
