Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: In today's Gospel, we hear how kingdoms and houses divided cannot stand. May we unite as one, in the name of God, to reach out and help others, and to fight for the dignity of all human life.

Dear friends in Christ.

May the peace and love of our Lord be with you all. Thank you to everyone who helped out with the June Fundraiser. It was a wonderful day and we had a great crowd. A good time was had by all. A special thank you to those of you who took time off from your places of work to set up, cook, clean, or to do whatever else was needed. Some of you put in a lot of time working. May God reward you for your kindness and for your sacrifices. They are truly appreciated.

Thank you to everyone also who set up the altars and to those who decorated them for our annual Corpus Christi Procession last Saturday. What a wonderful witness each of you give to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

You may have heard the expression: "The devil made me do it!" Well, that is a good excuse, but, it is only an excuse and nothing more. All of us are born with a "free will" and we choose what to do and what not to do. However, most of the time, we blame someone else for what we have done...that is if it is something bad. We do not often give credit to someone else when we have done something good. We see this in today's first reading from Genesis. God comes to the Garden of Eden and is looking for Adam, as if God did not know where Adam was. God knew that Adam had disobeyed Him and He wanted Adam to admit it. What does Adam do? Adam blames Eve for making him eat the fruit of the forbidden tree. Adam says, "The woman whom you put here with me...she gave me fruit from the tree, and so I ate it." And when God asks Eve why she did such a thing, Eve answers, "The serpent tricked me into it, so I ate it." In reality it wasn't Eve's fault that Adam ate the fruit. And, it wasn't the serpent's fault that Eve ate the fruit. It was their own fault for eating the fruit. They made a conscious decision to eat the fruit of the forbidden tree. No one twisted their arm or forced them in any way to eat it. Sure, they were a source of temptation to them, but, they did not force them to eat it. They chose on their own to eat the fruit. Each had the ability to say "yes" or "no."

We do this all the time. I can't tell you how many times someone comes to confession and tells me a long story of why they got mad or why they yelled at someone in anger or why they threw something at their spouse or why they got mad and hit the wall or broke a dish or something similar. They always blame their action on someone else like the other person forced them to do the bad thing. All of us are responsible for the actions we do, whether they are good or bad. Sure, the temptation may be there and someone may be making it difficult for us to control our actions, but ultimately it is our decision to do what we do. No one forces me to get drunk. I do it myself. No one forces me to take drugs. I make the decision myself to do it. No one forces me to curse. I myself choose to do it. No one forces me to have road rage. I alone let my anger get the best of me. No one forces me to say bad things about another person. I alone say those words and they come from my mouth and not from someone else's. No one else forces me to hit another person. I alone choose to hit them. The computer does not force me to look at pornography. I alone choose to look at it. No one forces me to pick up a gun and shoot another person. I alone choose to pick it up and shoot someone.

I hope you get the point I am making here. Let us all take responsibility for our actions and admit that we alone are responsible for what we have done. Let us do all we can so that we can make the right decisions in life and not let our emotions and feelings control us. Emotions and feelings are not some outside force that makes us do what we do. They are part of who we are. If we all spent a little more time in prayer and more time in church and more time in going to Mass and more time reading the Bible then maybe our emotions and feelings would be in check and we would respond to temptations and fears in a much different way. I can personally tell you that spending time in prayer each day, reading the Bible and going to daily Mass can certainly help you to be a calmer and more relaxed person, a person that is at peace in every situation in life. Maybe this is a new habit that you can get into in your life. Everything takes a little effort. It does not come automatically. But forming a good habit of prayer, Bible reading and daily Mass will certainly help you to automatically respond the right way when you are challenged or tempted in some way. Also, God will certainly help to form you into the person He meant you to be. But you have to allow Him to do it. He will not force it upon you. It is your decision, like everything else in life. God will help you to become the best version of yourself, as the writer Matthew Kelly says. The question is: Will you allow God to make you into the best version of yourself? Or, will you resist it? The decision is yours!

It is rather funny that when someone is willing to sacrifice their own desires, wants and needs in order to serve God and do what God wants them to do, other people just don't seem to understand it. They respond like the relatives of Jesus did in today's Gospel, "He is out of his mind." In a sense that is true because the person is not thinking just with his own mind but is one with the mind of the Father and therefore thinking with the mind of God. Therefore, in a positive way, you could say he or she is out of their mind. May our minds always be one with the mind of God so that His Will is fulfilled in our lives. Only then will we attain the peace and serenity we are seeking in this life.


