

About 3 months ago it was decided that we would refinish all of our sacred vessels, chalices, ciboria, etc., and also the candle sticks, the side tabernacle doors, and the main tabernacle. All of this work will cost about \$20,000.00, which is only a fraction of the cost if we were to replace them with new ones. We received donations from the Valenta and Rosipal families for part of this work. We are still need of donations to pay for the remaining portion of the cost. Dear friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice! The Lord is near!" (Philippians 4:4,5) This verse, taken from today's entrance antiphon and from today's second reading. It expresses the theme of this Sunday's readings and the reason we call this Sunday "Guadete Sunday." Today we wear rose colored vestments to remind us that we have passed the half-way point of this season and the joyful anticipation of celebrating the birth of the Lord increases within us.

Listed in this bulletin are the Penance Services of the parishes in our deanery. Please plan on going to Confession sometime before Christmas. Here at Holy Trinity, we will have our Penance Service today (Sunday, December 15) at 5 pm. It is one of the best ways that you can prepare your soul to celebrate the birth of the Savior. Our being cleansed of all sin in the Sacrament of Reconciliation brings joy to all the saints and angels in heaven. When we go to confession, we not only please God, but we make it possible for us to experience joy on a much deeper level and we experience the love and grace of God. Attached to this bulletin is a good examination of conscience to help you prepare to make a good confession.

In today's second reading, St. James offers us some good practical advice for this time of year when everyone's life is filled with much busy-ness and stress. St. James says, "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. ...do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged." How patient have you been lately? How much complaining have you done? It is sad that when we should be preparing for the celebration of the Birth of the Lord that people are running around like chickens with their heads cut off in the stores trying to get the best deal, worrying about what gifts they should be buying for family and friends. And, in the process, they get irritated and upset and their tempers flare. Patience is lost. On the news, all they speak about is how much money everyone is or is not spending. It seems the Advent Season is all about money and the economy. You never hear anything on TV about how we should prepare spiritually for Christmas. So, as we continue in this Season of Advent, I encourage you to take more time for prayer and less time for shopping. Remember that the greatest gift we can give is the gift of ourselves, both to our Lord and to one another. Remind others to read the daily readings and to pray together and attend daily Mass when possible. Spending more time in prayer is the best gift we can give to ourselves any time of the year.
