

#### Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. During October, we celebrate the month of the Rosary. Why should we pray the Rosary? We should pray it because it is a meditation on the life of Jesus. The prayers of the Rosary come from the Bible and are an expression of our life of faith. Just by reflecting on the mysteries of the Rosary, you will reflect upon the entire life of Jesus, from the moment of conception to His ascension into heaven. So, pray the Rosary daily, and enter into the fullness of the life of Jesus Christ. Mary wants all of us to have a closer relationship with her Son, that's why she gave us the Rosary to meditate upon.

October is also Respect Life Month. Let us all learn what the Church teaches about life issues, whether they are about abortion, birth control, tubal ligations, vasectomies, embryonic stem cell research, the death penalty, the elderly, the dying, the poor, immigration, the health care, marriage, and many other issues. All of these are important, but abortion is the most serious because it is the killing of a baby in the womb of its mother. It is the killing of the most innocent of life. Let us pray that the eyes of all may be opened to this horrible tragedy that takes place every day. Sometime this month come to the church for an hour of prayer to pray for respect for life in all its stages. May the laws of our country be changed soon so that all life is respected.

In today's Gospel, Jesus emphasizes the sacredness of marriage between a man and a woman. He also tells us of how divorce is against the will of God. This passage from the Gospel of Mark is also found in the Gospel of Matthew. In it, Jesus is changing the attitude of the people concerning the relationship between a man and a woman. He is definitely raising it to a much higher dignity than what was thought of at His time.

This teaching seems to be ignored by the majority of Christians in today's world. Marriage is to be taken seriously and is to be a lifelong relationship of just one man and one woman. Jesus says the "two become one flesh" and that "what God has joined together, no human being must separate." The Catholic Church teaches that a Sacramental Marriage is indissoluble, divorce is not an option. However, the Church also realizes that not all marriages, even though it may be in a church, are not necessarily a Sacramental Marriage. That is why we have the annulment process. An annulment is not a divorce. When the Church determines a marriage to be annulled it is stating that for some reason that particular marriage was not a Sacramental Marriage to begin with due to some impediment that was present at the time of marriage. It was a marriage, but not a Sacramental one. Only the Church has the authority as given to it by Jesus to make this judgment. Many times, one of the spouses becomes the victim in a divorce. One spouse wants to work things out, but the other one does not even want to try. Maybe they are already involved in an adulterous relationship with another person and, because of this grave sin, they are not willing to change the wrong they are doing. The one who wants to work things out and renew their marriage relationship then becomes the victim and suffers greatly. Or, maybe the spouse who was cheated on and hurt by the other is not willing to forgive as they should. This is a sad reality in life which hurts not only the spouse who wants to do what is right, but also hurts the children. We must pray that couples can remain faithful to their marriage vows and truly see their relationship as being sacred because they are united, by Jesus, to one another. Remember your vows: for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, until death do us part. May God bless all married couples with the courage, strength and love needed to be faithful to one another as God loves them.

October is Czech Heritage Month. What will you do to celebrate your Czech heritage? Here is a little reflection on today's Gospel:

Pro tvrdost vašeho srdce... tvrdá to řeč, že? Tvrdá pro toho, kdo nemá srdce zatvrdlé, ale obnovené a "poddajné" vůči Bohu. A právě v tom tkví celé řešení toho ožehavého problému nerozlučnosti manželství. Nerozlučnost manželského svazku má svoje místo v smlouvě nové, potvrzené krví Kristovou. Tato smlouva přetváří ty, kdo v Krista věří - proměňuje jejich tvrdé srdce v srdce nové, opravdu lidské (a zároveň božské, protože schopné vnímat Boží záměry). A v tomto kontextu evangelní nové smlouvy zaznívá slovo o nerozdělitelnosti manželství.

I když uvedená zásada je jasná, praxe je mnohem složitější. Především v tom, že manželství je záležitostí dvou lidí - a proto nestačí jen "dobrá vůle" (přesněji dobré, nové srdce) jednoho z partnerů. A navíc - i když je zpočátku jasné rozhodnutí a touha žít jako "nový člověk" (obnovený Kristem) pro druhého, časem ten prozářený krásný vztah začíná šedivět. A s tím ruku v ruce přicházejí myšlenky na odchod od "šedivého" (a nezajímavého) partnera.

Samozřejmě není možné poskytnout jednoduchý recept na vyřešení takových manželských krizí. Nicméně ve světle dnešního evangelia je možné nabídnout určitou cestu. Pokud je rozvod plodem tvrdého srdce (samozřejmě ponecháváme teď stranou náležité rozdílné hodnocení konkrétních případů), pak nerozlučitelnost je plodem srdce nového a obnoveného. A jaké jsou projevy tohoto nového srdce? Na pomoc nám přichází sv. Jan Zlatoústý. Tento moudrý učitel církve v jednom kázání (na Ef 5,21n.) radí, aby muž oslovoval manželku něžnými přívlastky (a ne pouhým jménem). V její přítomnosti má setrvávat raději než v přítomnosti jiných lidí. A ženě dává pro změnu radu "nedeptat" manžela ("ty jsi ale zbabělý lenoch!"), nesrovnávat ho s úspěšnějšími sousedy ("podívej se, jak on prosperuje, jak se stará o rodinu"). Dalo by se pokračovat v tomto výčtu, ale snad jako "základní pravidlo" poslouží Augustýnovo "miluj a čiň, co chceš". Láska k druhému totiž sama naučí, jak se chovat.

Není vůbec jednoduché zachovávat věrnost partnerovi - věrnost prokázanou nejen zachováváním manželské smlouvy, ale dokonce projevenou nepředstíranou dobrotou a něžností. A protože takový nárok má své místo v Nové smlouvě, pak manželskou smlouvu nemůžeme a nesmíme oddělit od smlouvy nové: čili nejen že jeden partner se nemá oddělit od druhého, ale dokonce ani od Krista. Protože manželství Nové smlouvy není společenstvím dvou, ale tří. (From Pastorace.cz)

Fr. Tom was born in 1959 and is a native of Havertown, Pennsylvania. In 1998, he became a member of the Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy. He is a 2004 graduate of Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut, and was ordained to the priesthood in May 2004.

Prior to his joining the Fathers of Mercy, Fr. Tom owned and operated his own roofing company and worked extensively with the Missionaries of Charity throughout the world and with the Padre Pio Center in Barto, Pennsylvania.

The Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy was founded in 1808 under the title of "The Missionaries of France." The order was founded for the purpose of evangelizing the French people after the Catholic Faith had been subjected to years of attacks and persecution during the French Revolution. After the suppression of the order by a new revolutionary regime some three decades later, many of the priests of the community came to America, and the Fathers of Mercy eventually became an American order.
