

Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! Please plan on joining us for our Parish Mission beginning today (Sunday, October 21). Grow in your relationship with Jesus by attending as many evenings of the Mission as possible.

Monday, October 22, is the feast day of St. John Paul II. Let us come to Mass (8:00 a.m.) and pray for his intercession in our lives.

In today's Gospel, Jesus must have felt some frustration with His apostles. They had been with Him for some time and had heard Jesus as He taught them and the people. But yet, they still did not understand much about the Kingdom Jesus was coming to establish. They still did not understand what it meant to be one of His disciples. So many times we simply do not understand what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus.

Today we hear James and John fantasizing about this new Kingdom. They must have heard Jesus say that He was going to Jerusalem to die. But they only heard what they wanted to hear. They saw glory ahead ... they saw the triumphant entry into Jerusalem that we remember on Palm Sunday. But Jesus saw suffering. He saw the Passion. He knew what His disciples would have to endure as well.

Oftentimes we, too, see the Gospel as James and John did. We see it as a "no-risk offer" -- we see the glory without the suffering. We think Christianity is going to give us only joy and hope without requiring anything in return. We think it is going to save us from our troubles. But that is a very selfish way of looking at the Gospel and Christianity. The reality, however, is as Jesus points out. Becoming a true disciple, a true Christian, brings trouble.

We, as Christians, are not to be like society is around us. We are called to be different. For us, authority does not come from the power to tell people what to do. We are to be servants. Actually, we are called to be more than just servants ... we are called to be slaves of Christ. We are told to give our lives to Jesus, but, despite our best efforts, we still fail. We are very much like the disciples. We bumble and stumble while looking for the glory. But it is not glory we are called to here on earth. It is service.

The disciples, even with their faults, still give us encouragement and are a model for us. In all their mistakes, they remained faithful to Jesus. Our call to be different is a call to be faithful to God. Faithfulness manifests itself in discipleship, which is a constant giving of ourselves for the needs of others. We must understand. We are not to be like the rest. We are called to be different. We are called to live our lives as Jesus taught us and continues to teach us through the Church. Let us try to be slaves of Jesus in giving our whole being to His service in our vocation in life and in our jobs and places of work, but most importantly, in our families. At times we know we will fail, but today's letter to the Hebrews also gives us much hope: "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weakness, but one who was tempted in every way that we are, yet never sinned. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and favor and to find help in time of need." Jesus is always there for us. Let us always have the humility needed to call out to Him.

October is Czech Heritage Month. Here is a short reflection on today's Gospel: "Dej, ať v tvé slávě zasedneme jeden po tvé pravici a druhý po tvé levici". Ti dva bratři Zebedeovi jsou nám bližší, než tušíme. Vždyť jim jde jednoduše o to... mít se dobře s Kristem. Zajistit si život. Pozici. V zásadě jde o legitimní touhy – každý z nás chce mít zajištěný život, určité společenské postavení (nikdo nechce být vyvrhelem!). A jsou to touhy vepsané do nitra každého člověka, samy o sobě dobré. Potíž nastává tehdy, když mají hlavní slovo v naší existenci. A ještě větší zádrhel vzniká tehdy, když diktují a určují náš život s Kristem – jinými slovy když máme zato, že Ježíš nám musí zajistit pohodlí, život bez problémů (žádné tragické události), úspěch ve společnosti (nebo v církvi, v pastoraci – rozkvět farnosti, modlitební skupiny), samozřejmě zdraví (uzdravení z nemocí)... A pokud neplní tato naše přání, pak se nám jeho evangelium tolik nelíbí. A nechce se nám ho následovat.

A zrovna tak jako těm dvěma bratřím, i na naše přání Kristus reaguje ve stejném stylu: nezavrhuje je, nesnaží se je vykořenit, ale uvádí je na správnou míru a do náležitých souvislostí. Chceš být "první ve společenství?" Ježíš ti neříká, že máš "odvrhnout tuto ambici", ale říká ti, jak to uskutečnit: buď tím posledním, který hledá prospěch druhých (a ne svůj). Který hledá způsoby, jak "poctít druhé" (a nehledá pro sebe tituly, "přední místa"). Přemýšlí a usiluje o to, jak druhé ocenit (za jejich služby), jak je "vyzdvihnout" na podstavec, jak je uschopnit k plnému životu.

Paradoxně právě tím, že "myslíme na dobro druhých", myslíme zároveň na své dobro. Službou druhým prokazujeme službu sami sobě. Uschopněním druhých uschopňujeme zároveň sebe. Ale přece jen je na místě vyslovit velké varování: i tato ochota ke službě má svá úskalí. Není správné si o sobě myslet, že mám jen sloužit – a nemám se nechat obsluhovat. To by opět bylo překroucení Nového zákona. Vždyť tam se jasně říká, že tím jediným služebníkem je Kristus – on jediný je ten, který nepotřebuje službu druhých. Nikdo jiný "na něj nemá" – a proto každý z nás potřebuje službu druhých. Tak to chce Bůh, protože sestavil tělo tak, že "oko nemůže říci ruce: ´nepotřebuji tě!´, ani hlava nemůže říci nohám: ´nepotřebuji vás!´" (1 Kor 12,21). Tak tedy – služ, a nech druhé, aby tě obsluhovali! A především dovol Kristu, aby ti sloužil! Jak mu to dovolit? Prosbou, aby se dotkl tvých bolestných ran, aby tě vyvedl ze strnulého stereotypu... Bez jeho služby prokázané tobě si nemůžeš dovolit sloužit druhým ("neumyji-li ti nohy, nebudeš mít se mnou podíl" – Jan 13,8).

Kristus je ten první ze služebníků, ba jediný skutečný služebník – a také ty, právě jako služebník, ho potřebuješ. (From Pastorace.cz) May all of you have a most blessed week.
